Talking of value there is also detail of what Newmarket community cinema has to offer.


Have a great month and enjoy the couple of long weekends that we will have, remembering that the bins will be on the Tuesday of those weeks.

## News From Holy Trinity Church Bottisham

As I write this we are in full preparation for the Induction and Installation of our new vicar The Rev. Malcolm Eric (Max) Osborne which will have taken place on Friday 19th April. The Service will be led by The Rt Revd. Bishop Dagmar Winter who is the Bishop of Huntingdon and acting Bishop of Ely, and the Archdeacon of Cambridge the Venerable Dr Alex Hughes. We are expecting large numbers of worshippers both locally from the Anglesey Benefice as well as those who were involved in the six rural



parishes around Horringer where Max was previously the Rector. In addition, it is customary to invite all those clergy who have been helping us out during the vacancy as well as those clergy from the wider Fordham and Quy Deanery of which we are part. Prominent people from the wider Diocese as well as those locally such as Chairpersons of Parish Councils and Headteachers of local schools are but some examples of others who will be attending. Unfortunately, due to a delay in maintenance work being done on the new vicarage in Beechwood Avenue, Max will not commence his activities locally until the first week of July, finally moving to Bottisham at the end of the school summer term.

The Benefice Easter Day Service, led by Rev. Liz Caswell, saw a packed church with, once again, a magnificent display of flowers put on by our dedicated team. Liz will also lead our Holy Communion worship on Sunday May 5th, with Sarah Maxwell leading our Morning Prayer on 19th May. We had a massive church clean in the week prior to Max's induction and thanks are given to the many people involved. However, we are looking for one or two more people to help with the regular church cleaning. If we can recruit, then duties would only be once every eight weeks with a more experienced partner. Immediate problems with the church structure are being managed. The damaged rendering on the north buttress of the chancel will be repaired by a local expert. The leaking roof over the east side of the south aisle has been inspected by a drone and roofing contractors are in the process of giving an estimate for its repair.

Two statutory church meetings are held each year. A Vestry meeting was held prior to our service on April 7th and at this, those on the Electoral Role of the church elected me as Churchwarden for my third year. The second – the Annual Parochial Church Meeting - will be held on Thursday 18th April when all Parishes in the Benefice, including our own, will discuss their reports for 2023 and elect the other officers who will serve on the PCC during the coming year.

Many thanks to those of you who generously contributed to our Easter Gift Day, your financial support is really appreciated. The amount raised is being counted at the moment and I will lead on this in the June Edition of the Cresset.

We hope to see you soon at one of our services.

## Parish Council Report

The next full council meeting will be held by on revised date of 16th May 2024, 7.30pm at the Poppy Room, Bottisham Sports and Social Club. Due to the late meeting in May, there will be no Parish Council meeting in June 2024, but matters will be attended to in the absence of a meeting under delegated authority. All Parish Council meetings are open to the public. Please note that the Clerk to the council does not keep regular office hours. Replies to emails and phone calls will be attended to as soon as is practicable.

#### **BOTTISHAM GREENWAY**

The Parish Council held a meeting with Peter Blake, currently Director of Transport and soon to be Interim Director of the Greater Cambridgeshire Partnership (GCP) at the end of May 2024, when the current Chief Executive, Rachel Stopard retires. The Parish Council were given the opportunity to speak frankly about our concerns for the Bottisham Greenway and the inadequate communication with residents by the project team. Mr Blake acknowledged that the GCP could have liaised more effectively with villages and expressed a desire to co-operate more fully with the Parish Council and residents in developing a scheme that best meets the needs of the village.

The village has now applied for 20 mph throughout the village under the Local Highways Initiative. Mr Blake acknowledged that this calls into question the need for a further, very similar, Greenway scheme through the middle of the village – with potential confusion for road users. He had also noted how heavily the area around the shops is used and careful thought was needed if the Greenway were to go past the Triangle.

In light of the above, the Parish Council requested that the GCP consider ending the Greenway at the back entrance to the village college on Bell Rd (just before Wisbeach Ave) – which is used by nearly all pupils accessing the school from the A1303. The Parish Council also asked for consideration of a spur off the Swaffhams Greenway, from the Lode Road crossroads down to the village college. It was felt that an upgrade to the footpath and cycleway here would be well supported by surrounding parishes – with many pupils using this route to get to school.

Mr Blake expressed willingness to explore the suggestions that the Parish Council had made and would respond in due course. Mr Blake further committed that the GCP would hold a face to face consultation with Bottisham residents, before any works commenced in the village.

#### RETIREMENT VILLAGE

After an extra ordinary meeting on 14th March, the Parish Council organised a resident's petition that highlighted public concern to East Cambridgeshire District Council (ECDC) about the Planning Inspectorate's approval of the proposed retirement village in Bottisham, requesting they apply for a Judicial Review (JR) of the decision. Cllrs Ogborn and Cundell

had a constructive meeting on Tuesday 19th March, with Director of Operations Isabel Edgar and District Cllr Cane. Isabel had a good understanding of the case and our concerns. Letters and all the petitions (at the time 700 which is around 30% of our village!) were handed in along with supporting documents. ECDC had engaged a King's Counsel (KC) to review the Appeal decision and, at the time, were awaiting his feedback.

Unfortunately, we heard from ECDC on 20th March that the KC had concluded that there were insufficient grounds to successfully pursue a JR. The KC advice was shared in confidence with the Parish Council, who had resolved on 14th March that we did not have the resource to separately pursue a JR without the full support of ECDC.

ECDC itself is unable to make public comment on the matter, as we are in the run up to an election. However, we are grateful for the following comment from Cllr Cane, that she is happy for us to publish.

"Following legal advice, both the Parish Council and the District Council decided not to pursue a Judicial Review. I know this is disappointing to many people, but their decisions were based on legal advice which considered the case in detail.

Now we need to turn our attention to mitigating the development and getting the best we can out of it for the village. One way to do this in the Planning System is through a Section 106 Agreement, which sets out the developer's obligations. This agreement is binding on future owners of the site, so remains relevant even if the site is sold on. Following normal practice, the S106 agreement for this development was drawn up and signed before the Appeal was decided. This is a public document, available on the Bottisham Parish Council website and the East Cambs Planning Portal - 23\_00205\_OUM-S106\_Decision-1562007 (eastcambs.gov.uk). The S106 gives some reassurance, in that they are tied to delivering the open space and the affordable housing:

P26 They can't occupy more than 50% of the retirement housing until they have transferred 50% of the Affordable housing and can't occupy more than 75% of the retirement housing until all of the Affordable housing has been transferred.

P30 They can't occupy more than 50% of the units until the Public Open Space has been transferred.

There is also some one-off funding for the surgery and the ambulance service, as well as for education. I realise this will not resolve the on-going pressures, but S106 agreements are limited in what they can require of developers.

The Appeal allowed outline consent, the developers now need to draw up detailed plans, with design details, access details etc and submit them to ECDC for approval. When the Parish Council presented their petition, the District Council explained that they were still awaiting the legal advice and would consider it carefully and share it, in confidence, with the Parish Council. They further committed, that if they did not go to Judicial Review, they would engage closely with the Parish Council when the application for detailed consent is received, and I will hold them to this."

## District Councillors' Report

The Council is advertising for an independent person to serve on its Audit Committee. The independent person will work alongside the elected councillors on the Committee. Appointing a robust independent person to the Audit Committee is the first step to creating an Audit Committee which can ensure strong governance and risk management. Charotte, John and colleagues asked some robust questions about increased agency costs, unrealistic fuel costs, and other elements of the ECSS budget. In 2023/23 East Cambs District Council paid East Cambs Street Scene an annual fee of £3 million to collect waste and recycling, and clean the streets. Two years later the council administration has just signed off a £4.6 million payment to deliver exactly the same service—an increase of fifty-three per cent. Mark and colleagues voted against the business plan.

The Operational Services Committee agreed the Council's Vulnerable community strategy. Charlotte asked why no formal assessment had been carried out of disabled parking spaces across the district, why restrictions on disabled spaces ceased in the evenings, and how disabled parking spaces were enforced—answers were unavailable at the meeting. After the meeting the Council simply confirmed that it had not carried out a survey and that it accepted no responsibility for on-street parking.

The budget for the Health & Wellbeing strategy was confirmed to be just £5,000, and questions were asked whether this was sufficient for the actions in the strategy, and what the service could do with more money.

The ECTC business plan for 2024/5 was approved by a majority. Charlotte, John and colleagues voted against the plan but were defeated. The company is not delivering more than thirty per cent affordable housing, which is what is required of any commercial developer, and it is not delivering a surplus for the council.

The Climate change and nature restoration chapter is the first step in the replacement of the council's increasingly out of date local plan. This piece of work is somewhat hampered by the Government's announcement that council local plans will not be allowed to be more ambitious for carbon reduction than current building standards.

Charlotte proposed that the council should ask officers to update us regularly on how far other councils are able to move the dial on this, and that we should ask the Chief Executive to write to the Minister pointing out the short-sightedness of his announcement, but we were defeated.

Consultation on the new chapter will take place in due course.

Hedgehogs were chosen by public vote to have their own Supplementary Planning Document. This proposed policy contains a number of measures such as creating 'hedgehog highways' via gardens through simple measures such as small holes created at the bottom of fences. For larger developments, the policy seeks wider habitat creation suitable for hedgehogs.

Consultation on the new policy will take place for a minimum of four weeks after the Police & Crime Commissioner elections in early May.

## Lucy Frazer MP for South East Cambridgeshire writes

I enjoyed seeing many of you at the Community Sports & Social Club for my open meeting at the end of March. I held the meeting to give residents an opportunity to raise issues of national and local importance with me, and those that came asked plenty of excellent questions.

Having met with the parish council just weeks earlier, I knew that the application for a retirement village would form much of the discussion. I explained to residents that I have written to the Planning Minister, Lee Rowley MP, to point out that the application has been accepted by the Planning Inspectorate despite lacking substantive difference to the previously refused submission. I also asked him what recourse might be available and I will be communicating this to the parish council.

From our meeting, I also know that some are concerned about the level of bus services in the village, especially after Stephensons pulled the Bottisham stop from the Number 11 route. I have been working closely with the parish council and the 'A to B1102' group to explore the potential for a new bus service to serve the villages along this stretch, which includes Bottisham. You may have filled in a survey on this in recent months, and I look forward to working on a resolution which best reflects local opinion.

Others shared concerns about anti-social parking in the local area. This is an issue that has been reported to me across the constituency, particularly on high streets, like in Soham and Ely. I have reported this to East Cambridgeshire District Council and am currently liaising with the leader of the council, Anna Bailey, about a volunteer enforcement team pilot commencing in the coming months. This is also an issue I have raised with the police, who continue to monitor it where possible.

On the 9th December 1920 the Government combined the Expeditionary Force Canteens and the Navy and Army Canteen board to run recreational establishments needed by the Armed Forces and to sell goods to servicemen and their families. ### Bottisham Bird Brain

Having been approached by a neighbour recently about a Tawny Owl hooting at night nearby, I had planned to focus on Owls this month; especially as we have a healthy array of owl species in this area, and there have been two or three Short Eared Owls knocking around Burwell Fen most of the winter. However, they'll have to wait, because 19th March changed everything when, approaching Swaffham Bulbeck on my bike, I heard my first Chiffchaff of the year!

That seemed pretty early to me and I realised that, at that time, we had experienced a week or two of stiff, somewhat warmer winds from the south, which had obviously brought in the first migrants from Africa. A small number of Chiffchaffs reside in the UK – mainly in the southern counties – all year round; but they'll be extremely difficult to see because they'll be foraging silently in thick cover most of the time, and they won't start singing until the temperature rises and the summer visitors arrive.

So let us have a look at the beautiful. Chiffchaff - Phylloscopus collybita - and its very close relative, the equally beautiful and delicate Willow Warbler - Phylloscopus trochilus. In fact, they so closely resemble each other that they are virtually impossible to tell apart by sight alone. Both birds are what are known 'Leaf Warblers' (Phylloscopidae) a sub-family of the Warblers (Sylviidae) and sport a rather plain olive plumage with paler underparts and an indistinct pale eye-stripe. On close inspection, you might see that the Chiffchaff is a tad more compact, even podgy, than the Willow Warbler, which is rather sleeker and longer-winged. And if you get a really good look, you might notice the Chiffchaff's colouring is usually slightly richer, or browner than the Willow



Warbler, including the bill and legs, but as they don't sit still for long and are rarely seen together, this is quite a challenge.

Less of a challenge is comparing their songs and, helpfully, they do stay perched whilst singing. As you may know, the Chiffchaff is one of the few birds with an onomatopoeic name, and its incessant chanting of "chiff chaff chiff chaff" from the tops of trees is diagnostic. The Willow Warbler, on the other hand, regales us with a soft, fluty, liquid refrain on a descending scale that peters out quietly at the end. Apparently, there are records

of birds performing a Chiffchaff beginning and a Willow Warbler ending but this has been attributed to the rare phenomenon of hybridisation! There is one oddity worth listening for though... I think Chiffchaffs sometimes 'forget the words' or develop a 'stutter', because it's not uncommon to hear two or more "chiffs" or "chaffs" consecutively, before they regain their composure and return to the traditional lyrics!

Both birds are exclusively insectivorous and will pick their food off leaves, especially the slower moving creatures like larvae or caterpillars, but they will happily pluck insects out of the air in flight too, like the Flycatchers. (But if you see a small brown bird habitually fly up to catch an insect, then return to the same perch, you probably have yourself a Spotted Flycatcher, not a warbler!)

According to the RSPB, Willow Warblers outnumber Chiffchaffs by up to 2:1 in summer in the UK, (even though they are Amber-listed due to recent decline, and Chiffchaff numbers have increased steadily over the last four decades). However, in this area – in fact the south-east overall – you will encounter many more Chiffchaffs than Willow Warblers as the populations of the latter are much denser in Wales, Scotland and the north of England. Chiffchaffs seem to be everywhere in this area at the moment, whereas – at the time of writing in mid-April – I have yet to hear a Willow Warbler. Admittedly, they do typically arrive a good fortnight after the Chiffchaffs but, personally, I never feel that summer is truly on its way until I've heard the serenade of the Willow Warbler!

It's always worth remembering how special, our migrant visitors are... Chiffchaffs and Willow Warblers typically weigh between seven and nine grams (that's around the weight of a one pound coin!) and twice a year, most of them fly several thousand miles between Europe and their wintering grounds in southern Europe/North Africa, in the case of the Chiffchaff, or sub-Saharan Africa in the case of the Willow Warbler. No wonder they only usually live for about two years.

By the way, if anyone is interested in bird numbers, trends, movements or conservation statuses, the British Trust for Ornithology has an extremely informative website: www.bto.org which you can search, bird by bird, topic by topic, until your mind is boggled by the sheer volume of data that has been collected on these fascinating creatures!

## **Public Transport Matters**

Now that the clocks have changed to British Summer Time and the days are getting longer it makes sense to think about getting out more by bus, as bus travel is currently exceptionally good value because of the government-sponsored £2 maximum fare cap on single journey bus fares. This promotion lasts until the end of December 2024. So, for instance, you can get all the way from Cambridge to Peterborough or to Bedford for just £2, or from Newmarket to Mildenhall or to Bury St Edmunds just for £2.

The excellent people at the non-profit company Good Journey Network CIC, which champions car-free leisure travel, believe that everyone should have access to culture, Their leisure nature. without needing a car. brilliant website www.goodjourney.org.uk features over 400 attractions to visit car-free and which enable people who get there without using a car to enjoy discounts, such as up to 50% off entry or free drinks. What I particularly like about this website is that both shows you how to get to leisure attractions by using public transport (laying it out step-by-step) but also has a Journey Planner feature.

Local tourist attractions which have done a deal with Good Journey and are featured in their website include Anglesey Abbey, the National Horseracing Museum at Newmarket, the Ickworth Estate near Bury St Edmunds and Little Hall at Lavenham.

Another really useful website, this time describing and promoting the bus journey itself, as well as the destination, is Great Scenic Journeys, at www.greatscenicjourneys.co.uk/. This website is designed by a group of people who have been active at a senior level in the UK transport industry for many years. It is amazing what views you can see from the top deck of a double-decker bus travelling through the countryside, and this website covers a number of scenic bus routes in every rural area of England and across Wales, Scotland and Ireland too. Not only that but it also features our 12 bus route linking Cambridge to Newmarket via Bottisham. That particular page is at www.greatscenicjourneys.co.uk/journey/12-cambridge-to-newmarket/. I'm pleased to see that the descriptions of Bottisham on that page are very complimentary: the view from the bus of Bell Road, the High Street and their surroundings certainly impressed the website's authors.

Lastly, although bus travel is currently very cheap for most of us because of the £2 fare cap, it can actually be completely free at much of the day if you are eligible for a Concessionary Bus Pass (for OAPs and people with a Disability). So if you are eligible, make sure you apply for a Pass. The process is simple, quick and free. Go to https://transport.cambridgeshirepeterborough-ca.gov.uk/buses/free-bus-passes/ to see if you are eligible and to see how to apply for a pass if you are.

**Appointments:** This Practice is in the top 14 of the area with one day wait appointments and 90.7% face to face appointments. Unfortunately, from the 1st March to the 8th April there were 61 appointments where patients failed to attend. We appreciate that there will be some circumstances beyond our patients control, but where possible, can we request that if you are unable to attend an appointment it is cancelled so another patient can utilise it.

**Dispensary:** The new Dispensary Manager Sara Harnwell is now in post. Unfortunately the Practice continues to experience delays from suppliers, particularly after Bank Holidays, so your patience is requested and as always, appreciated. We have two upcoming Bank Holidays in May, for any repeat prescriptions, please ensure prescriptions are given to the Dispensary team by the 26th April and 17th May, to ensure availability by Fridays 3rd and 24th May, respectively. To clarify, when we advise we need five working days, this is five full working days, the date of submission is not included. Please also note that the Government are increasing prescription charges from £9.65 to £9.90 from the 1st May 2024.

**Telephone System:** Our new system is due to be installed in week commencing 22nd April. Whilst full training is included in the package, your patience is requested as our teams will be learning whilst on the job. The new system has many new facilities, which over time we will use to measure and where possible improve our service but one element you will notice straight away is the automatic call back facility.



## Bottisham Airfield Museum Group (BAMG)

I would like to thank all those who attended the first Museum open day of the year on Sunday 31st March, which was a record-breaking day for attendance. I was privileged to meet one of our regulars, Peter Dawson, who together with Colin Marsh witnessed a midair collision over Bottisham Airfield on 18th August 1944. A P47 Thunderbolt returning to Duxford collided with a P51 Mustang, one of a number in the traffic pattern waiting to land at Bottisham. Why the pilot of the Thunderbolt flew over Bottisham Airfield as the Mustangs were lining up to land will never be known, as both pilots sadly died.

One of our new exhibits is a boy and girl mannequin dressed as evacuees from London in WW2. Some of you may remember that children were ordered to leave London to stay with foster families in the countryside towns and villages, as my father did. This exhibit is part of our revamped WW2 home front display.
