Cresset May Issue 415

"Ne'er cast a clout, till May be out"

That well known phrase is often quoted at this time of year and always raises that age old discussion about what May are we talking about. Is it the month of the year, or the blossom on the trees? The Blossom is the Hawthorn tree of which there is a lot, one of the commonest trees in England. But that, I would say comes out too early to satisfy the proverb. We often get another cold spell or even frost after the flowers are out.



So, I would go with the month version. There is another phrase which I like and definitely refers to the month.

"Button to chin, till May be in, Cast not a clout till May be out"

I love finding the origins of phrases and how they have been altered over the centuries. There is another which is interesting and is again about the hawthorn

The hawthorn has long been a potent symbol of rebirth and appears as May, in other old rhymes; for example, 'Here we go gathering nuts in May'. But that is probably a corruption of 'Here we go gathering knots of May [blossom]'. After all, there are no nuts to collect in England until Autumn and certainly not in May.

But it is not just the hawthorn which has been blooming. The whole countryside has erupted in its annual show. Flowers and leaves coming out everywhere and early too. The birds are all nesting and chicks are already starting to leave the nest. Let's hope this summer is a good one.

Mind you, it does mean that you can no longer put off all those jobs you have been delaying because you said you'd "wait till the weather improves"! Like painting those windows and repairing the fence.

Other matters now. Last month, one of Bottisham's best known residents passed away. Following not long after his brother Albert, Ed Rank who died at the fair age of 93, was a great supporter of all things Bottisham. From the Village College to the Church, the Bowling Club and the Royal British Legion, Ed will be missed.

With another two bank holidays this month, there is lots of opportunity for relaxing and enjoying what will hopefully be a good month of weather.


So give the old BBQ a good wire brushing and have a good month.





Bottisham Patients' Group

Action Plan for 2014/15

The Patients' Group (PG) Committee met on 27th March and approved an action plan which the Practice will take forward following the results of the General Practice Assessment Questionnaire (GPAQ) survey last January. For yet another year, we appreciate the very high standards of care that the staff at Bottisham Medical Practice provide and the consequent high levels of satisfaction shown by patients in the survey, particularly in the current context of reduced funding and increased demand for Primary Care. The two areas for concern focussed on the appointments system with the access it gives to doctors and nurses, and patients' need for more health advice and information. The following five points attempt to address these concerns as well as others which should improve the services available to patients.

1. Increase patients' awareness of the Practice's services, systems and processes

Comments made in the survey showed that not all patients are aware of all the services provided by the Practice and clarification is needed to give them a better understanding of Primary Care and its limitations. The PG will continue to work with the Practice to disseminate information through articles and events which benefit the full range of patients.

2. Review current appointments system, clinics and opening times

While the Practice has employed an additional GP and provides above the national average of 100 appointments per 1000 patients, better methods of managing demand will be considered, e.g. telephone triage, where a doctor is available to give advice on the phone or see a patient with urgent need, and/or shift working. A nurse is currently training to provide the possibility of a Minor Ailments service. However, a further decrease in funding this year means that the Practice cannot consider extending opening times.

3. Improve the monthly repeat prescription and electronic prescription services

The Practice currently dispenses around 10,000 prescriptions each month. Improvements to these services are currently being investigated and it is hoped that it will be possible for patients who wish it to have their repeat prescriptions dispensed automatically for collection each month.

4. Promote greater awareness of opportunities for self-care

The PG will work with the Practice to encourage patients to keep themselves healthy, self-treat minor ailments and self-manage their long-term conditions where possible. The Practice's website currently receives between 5000 and 8000 hits a month. The range of advice available will be increased, including links to sites promoting health awareness, e.g. the Self Care Forum. The range of leaflets and information available at the Practice will be reviewed and doctors and nurses will make patients more aware of useful sources of help and advice.

5. Increase the engagement of younger patients with the Practice

Although the age profile of patients at the Practice remains fairly stable, a need to engage patients aged 13-24 in health awareness is recognised. The PG will seek feedback from pupils at Bottisham Village College about their health interests and a new page on the Practice's website will focus on teenage health issues.

Cambridgeshire Fire and Rescue Service

After two years, Cambridgeshire Fire and Rescue Service Community Champions scheme has been acknowledged as a success by CFRS, but continues to need volunteers in other villages to improve our cover to help all communities stay fire safe.



The Champions promote fire safety in their communities by attending local events to spread the word, talk to local groups and organisations and, importantly, also refer vulnerable people to CFRS for home fire safety visits.

Following on from last month's reminder on electrical safety and appropriate fuses, a few words of advice on safety in the kitchen – where over half of all home fires start. A large proportion of these are caused by appliances. Regularly maintain dishwashers, washing machines and driers – and never leave them on when you go out. Keep all flammable items, such as dishcloths, tea towels and utensils away from hobs. How many of us have melted, deformed or burnt utensil handles? Deep fat friers are safer than chip pans, but do not over fill or over heat them – smoke is a warning and you know what can follow!

Distraction is the biggest cause of kitchen fires – children, telephones, the TV and now the internet can all divert attention away from the kitchen.

No more "OMGs – I forgot the ***** ". Don't cook when tired or under the influence!

Please do make sure that fire safety continues to stay at the forefront of your mind throughout May, and always – and don't forget to **test your smoke alarms**, and the smoke alarms of the vulnerable and elderly in your neighbourhood.

Parish Council Notes

It was good to see several residents at the April meeting who had come to hear what was happening in the village. They were able, at the start of the meeting to ask any questions that they might have for parish councillors which is an opportunity that all residents have.

Cllr Altham and Cllr Bryant have met again with two of the village college governors. They had previously discussed the possibility of having an area of land at the rear of the school as provision for a play area but it was felt that the area that had been outlined was not appropriate as the area needed to be more visible which was echoed by the police. It was a positive meeting and talks continue.

We had also contacted the Park Estate Residents Association regarding the possibility of having a pre-school play area provided on the dirthills area but this had been rejected and Cllr Heider will speak with them again outlining in more detail what is required.

We have been disappointed with the response from the County Council regarding the planned traffic calming for Bell Road and Tunbridge Lane. Application forms were filled in over a year ago, funds secured and agreement made by the County on what was to be put in place. A start date was initially given of October 2013 which then changed to spring 2014. After receiving no response from the person who had been dealing with the application we found out that he had left employment with the County Council and no one had taken over his work. After our County Councillor Mathew Shuter contacted the Highways Department we have had a site meeting with Adam Cobb who has now made several suggestions and alterations to the original plans which had previously been agreed. We are particularly concerned that it had been agreed that a 30mph sign would be put at the entrance to Bottisham as traffic came off of the A1303 and now we are being told that they cannot do this and we have to have a 40mph sign going down to 30mph, even though this had been endorsed by the police. County Councillor Shuter will be contacting Highways expressing his concerns and we will also be writing to let them know how let down we have been by the County Council. We now have no idea as to when the traffic calming may start.

Streetlighting has also been an area of concern and of many complaints. Holes have been dug ready for posts to be installed and then just left. Communication from Balfour Beatty has not been very forthcoming but County Councillor Shuter has been told that the work will be completed by 13th April in time for a duathlon taking place in the village.

Cllr Buchanan reported that a planning application will soon come in for 24 new homes on the Crystal Structures site in Tunbridge Lane. Nearby residents have been in contact as they have already received letters informing them of the proposed application. The planning application will be online on the East Cambs District Council website for all to view.

County Councillor Shuter reported that there will be a review of recycling centres and a consultation as they are looking to reduce the number of centres and then modernise the ones they are left with. The centre at Milton is being looked at as it is not up to modern standards. It is aimed that all recycling centres are reachable in a 20 minute car journey. An introduction of a £1 parking charge will be brought in at park and ride sites in May. This charge will last for 18 hours to cover workers working shifts etc. This will cover the cost of running the buses and site and toilets etc. which will be refurbished and opened up. There will be a 1 hour waiting time for cars picking up people from the buses.

Please don't forget we will be repeating the kerbside electronic recycling collection day. This will be on May 22nd. Please look out for the poster in the Cresset and all around the village nearer the time which explains exactly what they will collect. For larger items you can ring them and they will come and remove them for you. (Parish Council Notes continued on page 26.)

The last collection in December generated an income of £178.64 for Parish Council which will be put back into the village. Collections were made from 137 dwellings and it would be great to beat that figure this time round.

Also on this date (22nd May) is the Parish Council Annual Meeting which will be held at 7.30pm in the Poppy Room at the Royal British Legion. All residents are welcome to come and here what Parish Council has been up to the past year and find out what is in store for 2014/2015. We still have a vacancy on the Parish Council and this could be a good opportunity for anyone interested to find out a little bit more about what is involved. I look forward to seeing some new faces as well as the more regular ones on the 22nd.



Bottisham and District Gardening Club

At our March meeting Terry Raynor gave an interesting and informative talk about Terwins Seeds. After learning crop inspection on a 2 week course in Cambridge, it allowed him to inspect crops on behalf of the Ministry, he met farmers from all over the country. Later he took a job at Mr Fothergills. In 2003 he decided to sell his own seeds to the public and he started with vegetables then went on to herbs and flowers. He started with one garden shed and within a year he had three garden sheds. Now he operates from a 650 square unit in Cockfield. He tries to stock old varieties of seeds which are sourced from two wholesalers in Essex. He told us that 95% of seeds are grown abroad, they need a long growing season and this country is too wet. When packaging the seeds all of the counting is done by hand. Larger seeds keep longer than small ones. For the future the company aim to progress by selling seeds online, attend more markets, and go to more shows.

He has written articles for magazines, talked on BBC Radio Suffolk and was interviewed for Anglia News when they discussed the impact of the bad weather. He can be found selling seeds on Bury market most Saturdays, he is always sure to take along his 4 bestsellers which are Boltardy beetroot, Earl Nantes carrots, White Lisbon spring onions and Little Gem lettuce.



Public Transport Matters

Compared with many villages we do have a good bus service but, of course, like the shop, the pharmacy and other local services we do need to 'use them or lose them'. Paper timetables are available in the post office and it is, of course, all on the web. A handy guide is that the bus 10 to Cambridge leaves the centre of the village every hour at about 5 past the hour until 18.05 and returns from Cambridge at 25 past the hour until 15.25 and then 10 mins, later with the last bus back at 18.45. The 11 and 12 give us an extra service but it does mean getting to and crossing the A1303 - 22 and 52 past the hour to Cambridge and 50 and 20 to return from Cambridge until 18.50. The latest timetable for the guided bus is March 30th - Mondays have a good market in St. Ives. Gloomy stories in the Cambridge News regarding '£20 million busway faults shock'. Suffolk County Council does have a very good range of leaflets and booklets on public transport in Suffolk. The website is www.suffolkonboard.com and the leaflets are available in Newmarket library. It would be good if Cambridge County Council could do something similar. There is a leaflet now in the Grand Arcade on how to access Cambridge - bike, train, bus, etc. - www.cambridgebid.co.uk As our use of Newmarket rail station continues we have looked into a bus connection from the centre - there is the 16 run by Suffolk Rider but only roughly every hour. Parking is very limited. Useful advice on Suffolk rail travel is provided by MARPA - midAnglia Rail Passengers Association - www.marpa.org.uk.

Spring has sprung and days out beckon - Nenta Train Tours - 01692 406152 and also the very popular Go Whippet coastal tours - 01954 230011 - ask to be picked up from the A1303 if that is part of the route. OAPs travel free using their bus pass. Days out or longer holiday trips can be booked with National Express coaches either from our own post offices - it works, we have just done it! - or from Premier Travel at Drummer St. They are presently advertising £5 single fares in some instances - nationalexpress.com. On a recent trip to Northampton we discovered the smart new bus station that has opened recently. Eurolines cover Europe and let you see the countryside. Ferrylines are advertising their benefits as opposed to the hassle of airports - have a short cruise with good food and comfortable lounges. France, Belgium, Ireland or indeed a ferry to many of the islands around the British Isles. Take Brittany Ferries to Cherbourg with your bike and enjoy the French countryside - 0871 244 0744. Or take the Eurostar to Paris, switch to the double-decker TGV and enjoy a comfortable train ride to Spain and the Costa Brava - 2 hrs. to Paris and 5 1/2 to the Spanish border.

Abellio Greater Anglia have a useful leaflet on their 2 for 1 offers on attractions, hotels, etc. Always ask for the best railway deal - there are the '2 together' railcards and it seems there is a '4 for 2' also (Groupsave). Plusbus gives you a linked bus pass to your train ticket.

Still the arguments over HS2 - now it has to be slowed down to prevent pollution; the link to the channel tunnel has been abandoned; bring it forward to revitalise the North. However the people in the rail industry - e.g. Stagecoach Group, Network Rail, DB Schenker, Abellio Uk write to The Times backing the project. A major boost is foreseen for the British economy as Hitachi of Japan's famous bullet train is set to move to Britain including bidding for the HS2; there is a forecast for an increase from 200 to 1800 staff in 3 years.

Crossrail continues to expand and Bombadier are bringing jobs to Derby after winning a £1billion contract. Crossrail will run from Berkshire to Essex.



Thoughts of a Sports Nut

Well, they made it, and how! The Cambridge & District Schools' team reached the final of the English Schoolboys U15 National Football Cup with a stunning home victory over South London Schools, which was as impressive as it was unexpected (at least by the away team, anyway!). Sporting no fewer than three Bottisham lads, Messrs Crisp, Fullwood & Taylor, plus another BVC pupil, Toby 'Biscuit' Bicknell, the Cambs team displayed great resilience in the early stages and grew in confidence as they took a 2-0 lead, running out eventual 3-2 winners after a tense last few minutes where the visitors threw everything at the stubborn home side.

The final against Liverpool is a two-legged affair and, again, the first match at Cambridge Utd will be over by the time you read this. Regardless of what happened at the Abbey Stadium on 24th April, this is a tremendous achievement by the Cambridge lads and I'm sure the return leg at Goodison Park on 8th May will be the experience of a lifetime for these courageous young men. Good luck to them!

You may remember the subject of 'camping' being mentioned by my esteemed colleague, the author of Jolley Old World, in the March issue of The Cresset. Did it pique your curiosity as much as it did mine? If so, you may be interested in what Tony and I discovered about this strange, ancient pastime, once popular in our very own Bottisham.

Between the 16th and 19th Centuries, a Game of Camping was typically played between teams from rival parishes on a special field set aside for the purpose – the camping-place, camping close or camping pightle – often sited near the church as it was customary to play games after church services. Of East Anglian origin, the game was rough, tough and dangerous and it was recorded that a match at Diss Common in the early nineteenth century was so brutal that nine men were killed or died of their injuries!

So, what of the rules? Well, there were goals and a ball... sound familiar? Actually there were two goals per team, usually formed of the 'thrown off clothes of the competitors' (jumpers for goalposts?!) and each pair were up to 200 yards apart. Teams comprised up to 15 players a side and the ball was of cricket ball size. A neutral spectator would throw the ball in the air to start the game and the teams would scrap for possession, the object being to carry the ball through an opponents' goal to score a 'notch' or 'snotch'. If a player was caught in possession of the ball, he would lose a 'snotch', so the challenge was to throw it to a 'less beleaguered friend' when in imminent danger of being caught. The match was won by the first team to win seven or sometimes nine snotches, which often took several hours. The use of a larger 'foot-ball' changed the name of the game to 'Kicking Camp' and, played with shoes on, it became 'Savage Camp'!

But, where there's sport, there's controversy, and the level of violence was a particular bone of contention. To some, camping represented 'a combination of all athletic excellence', whilst, to others, it was tantamount to a mass brawl, the contest never ending without 'black eyes and bloody noses, broken heads or shins, and some serious mischief.'

Woodbridge based historian Edward Moor, who described Camping in his book of "Suffolk Words and Phrases" in 1823 was most enthusiastic: "It is a most noble and manly sport... Indeed it is very animating to see twenty or thirty youths, stripped to the skin, and displaying the various energies that this game admits of; rushing with uplifted eye, breast to breast, to catch the descending ball, and all, at once, running full ding to gain a point... amid the shouting and roaring of half the population of the contiguous villages."

However, the brutality of Camping eventually seemed to diminish its popularity and, by the 1830s, the boxing element of the game had been banned, (Sports Nut continued on page 49.)



giving way firstly to a 'civil game' involving passing the ball from hand to hand, and then to a 'gentler' kicking and passing game, which was to develop into 'the beautiful game' of Association Football once the outlawing of hacking and handling precipitated the split of football from the 'Rugby Football' code of rules. Even then, soccer (the word, by the way, being a nickname derived from 'Association') was barely recognisable as the same sport played on turf carpets by today's over-hyped, over-paid (mainly foreign) malingerers and drama queens in the British professional leagues, but that's another tale for another day...

Thank you Tony for the 'Camping' challenge. I hope our readers enjoy this whimsical meander into sporting history!



Jolley Old World

An Account of Bottisham Recreation Ground - Past & Present - Part II:

In my previous article we had established that a search for land for a village Recreation Ground was started in 1919, after the First World War, when the village declared the old 'Camping Field' site next to the Church no longer fit for purpose. Bottisham Recreation Ground (BRG) was eventually founded in 1924 on land leased to the village by Mr Soames Jenyns. A 'brick' pavilion was built by the village for the new Recreation Ground and was presented to the Parish Council in 1925.

Most village recreational pursuits moved to the new BRG including football and cricket. But not the local 'boy meets girl' pursuits which remained firmly rooted in the proximity of the Church Yard or 'down Bendish'. To this day some residents in the Jenyns Close/Pound Close area continue to dig up old cricket balls. During the period from 1925 to 1936 numerous references are made in Parish minutes to acts of vandalism on the Recreation Ground, broken windows in the pavilion, uprooted fencing and broken gate posts to name but a few!! And it was toward the end of this period that Bottisham Village College (BVC) commenced construction providing both a lower and upper school with 'substantial' playing fields.

Thus, in November 1936 the 'special community relationship' between the College and the village began when the Cambridgeshire Education Committee (CEC) wrote to Parish Council and asked whether children attending the College could use BRG for games Monday to Friday. According to the Warden, Mr D W Philips, the College Playing Fields would not be ready for at least another year or so. In the Parish Council minutes of 19 November 1936 it is recorded that PC considered this request satisfactory and permission was granted to the College to use the facilities of the village Recreation Ground and this arrangement continued through until 1941 even though BVC playing fields were in use by then.

The matter of the lease on BRG was discussed at a Parish Council meeting in April 1938 where a Miss Towler proposed writing to the King George V Playing Fields Trust for some assistance in locating an alternative location in case BRG should be sold at the end of the lease period which expired on 10 October 1943. The lease on BRG was also subject to 'a long discussion' by Parish Council on 7 February 1939 but unfortunately the transcript of this discussion cannot be found or was not actually recorded.

Then in 1941 it was the turn of BVC to reciprocate and to come to the aid of the village when the Air Ministry requisitioned BRG to provide air crew accommodation in April 1941. In view of the circumstances the Warden was asked if an informal arrangement could be made that would allow the village temporary use the College Playing Fields. A 'Gentlemen's Agreement' must have been reached as there is no written record of this request being granted or refused by the Warden. But anecdotal evidence such as that from Tony Newman, who was a teenager at the time, does help to clarify the position:

Tony's father, Noel, was one of two Parish Council representatives on the Village College Council – the other was a Mr JGA Paul. Tony relates to being told about discussions going on about a new Recreation Ground. These discussions involved Mr George Edwards the Warden at the Village College and the Parish Council. Mr Edwards was very supportive of the village community using the College Playing Fields and an 'understanding' was reached with the College in favour of the village using the College Playing Fields on a more permanent basis.

It is also important to emphasise that Tony Newman's account (January 2014) is given credence in whole and in part by the recollections of a number of other established long term residents of the village. (Jolley continued on page 55.)



Even though a temporary arrangement for the Recreation Ground had been reached with the College; the matter of the lease on BRG was again raised at Parish Council in April 1943 and a letter was sent to Mr S Jenyns asking what his intentions were when the lease expired later that year. Alas there is no record of a response having been received from Mr Jenyns but having spoken to Roger Jenyns (February 2014); it seems possible that whilst the BRG was under war time 'requisition' and the future of the site was uncertain, his father considered it pointless renewing the lease. Roger is confident however that the land was intended to have been leased back to the village as a Recreation Ground when the future was more assured.



RE:NEW

Living in a Fog.

At the time of writing we have just had three days of most unpleasant atmospheric pollution. Going outside there was a smell in the air, a metallic taste in the mouth and a stinging in the eyes. The phrase 'Killer Smog' was being headlined in certain newspapers. It brought back memories for me of the 'pea-soup' fogs we used to have when I was a boy. I can remember on certain occasions going out with my friends after school, armed with torches, to the main road where we would tell the motorists crawling their way home exactly whereabouts they were, and if they were coming off into our streets, walking in front of them with the torches, showing them the way round the corners and setting them on the right road.

I also remember a time, living near the Thames in Grays, Essex in the early 1960s when we had a thick fog which never lifted for about five days. For all that time we could hardly see across the road, and everyone was crawling about as though half-blind. What a fantastic feeling it was to look out one morning and be able to see again!

At RE:NEW, in the period leading up to Easter, we were looking at some of the people encountered by Jesus in the Gospel of John. One of these was a beggar who had been blind from birth. Jesus took him to one side and did a very strange thing. He spit on the ground and made some mud which he smeared on the man's eyes. Then he told him to go and wash it off in a certain pool in Jerusalem. When he washed the mud from his eyes the man could see for the first time in his life. What must that have been like?

The Gospel uses this story to illustrate the fact that many people are spiritually blind – unable to see clearly the truth of God in the world around them. Jesus came to open the eyes of people like that, and he still does it today. John Newton, the 18th Century slave-trader turned hymn-writer, used the words of the blind man in his best known hymn 'Amazing Grace': 'I once was lost but now am found, was blind but now I see.'

Many people have found those words true in their lives today. If you are not one of them, why not take a look?





Bottisham WI

Our March AGM meeting was a reminder to us of all that we had done and achieved in the last year reminding us of the interesting speakers we had heard, memories of our 95th Birthday Celebrations and ways in which we had supported village events.

Our speaker for the meeting was Sue Hotchkiss, a WI member from Burwell WI who showed slides and told with several amusing anecdotes her story of her "African Ascent -Climbing Kilimanjaro". She told us it was her challenge to herself in celebration of her 50th Birthday. The actual climb took 5 days and there was a crew of 40 for the 16 climbers with porters who carried all their luggage, tents and food. Each day was difficult walking from 9 to 5 and in daily stages they reached 8,500ft, 12,000 ft and then the final staging point of 14,000ft at Mawenzi Tarn. Four members of the group had succumbed to various forms of altitude sickness by this stage but the rest including Sue and her husband Nigel reached the top. 2 girls in their early 20's were carried up the final part by Humphrey one of the guides (one under each arm)! They had left their base at midnight, complete with head lamps, saw the rising sun and walked for about 10 hours over scree and snow to reach the rim of the volcano. They were afforded wonderful views when they were at the summit at 19340ft. They then walked back to their starting hotel for a night, (hot water comfortable beds and flushing loos) before having a few days on safari in Tanzania. The name Kilimanjaro in the local Chugga dialect means "hard to conquer" so Sue did extremely well. Quite an achievement considering how flat East Anglia is and that she had major back surgery in the 1990's!

Our walking group visited Wandlebury recently and saw the vast areas of cowslips just coming into bloom and the Highland Cattle followed by refreshments at the Gog Magog Farm Shop.
