

Anglesey Abbey and Wicken Fen

The re-introduction of the small but extremely rare Tansy beetle made the headlines at the beginning of September. The beetle with its metallic green appearance was last seen on the Fen over three decades ago. Its last stronghold in the country is a 30 km stretch of the Great Ouse, nr York. As the beetle had a good breeding year up North, the decision was made to relocate around 200 beetles to Wicken. It gets its unusual name because it mainly eats tansy, a perennial herb.

Walking is a great way to get out and enjoy the rich colours of autumn. This October we have a range of walks at Wicken Fen as part of the Trust's Great British Walking Festival. We start with Walk with a Ranger – a short introductory walk around the fen every Wednesday from 1 – 22 October, 2.30 -3.30pm. Walking in the Footsteps of Wicken's scientists – (1 -24 October, 10am -3pm) is a self-guided trail looking at some of the scientists who have been associated with Wicken's fascinating history. If you fancy a longer walk we have Walk the Fens on Saturday 18th - the day starts at 10.30am with a five mile walk returning to Wicken for lunch with a further five mile walk in the afternoon leaving at 1.30pm. You can join for either or both walks. Please note this is a social walk with a leader, rather than a guided walk. Finally you have the opportunity to lose the shoes and try our Family Barefoot Walk on Saturday 25 Oct, 10am -3pm. The trail will take around 30 minutes with activities and challenges en-route. Trails (£2 per child) will be available from the Visitor Centre.

Our popular Mucky Pups programme for under 5s continues with **Autumn Animals** on 8 & 9 Oct - sessions run from 10.15 -11.45, tickets £4 can be booked from the Visitor Centre on 01353 720274. For the half term holidays we have **Autumn Adventure**, a mix of games, craft and outdoor fun on 28 October and **Batty Halloween** on 31 October. Sessions run from 10.30 -12.30pm or 2-4pm, tickets £4.75 per child are available from the NT Box Office on 0844 249 1895 – advance booking essential.

Down at Anglesey Abbey, we have **Awesome Autumn** throughout October. This is a chance to enjoy the gardens amazing autumnal colours, create some wild art, play conkers and jump around in huge piles of leaves. You can also learn how to climb trees with professional instruction from the Big Tree Climbing Company. Sessions (minimum age 6+) are being held on 28 & 29 October and cost £16.54 for a one hour session. Tickets can be booked on-line by following the links from the Events page of the Anglesey Abbey website.

Finally, we will be illuminating the gardens for our **Winter Lights Festival** for three weekends starting on Friday 28 November. This year we have an extended route and new lighting and effects to enjoy. Tickets (Adults £11.50 Children £8 Family Ticket £35) are available from the NT Box Office on 0844 249 1895.



Better together!

As I write this things are getting tense! It is less than a week to the referendum on Scottish independence. Whatever happens many people are going to be bitterly disappointed. We should be very grateful that this is taking place through a democratic process. All over the world fragmentation is taking place. Countries are divided. People are engaged in bloody struggles for separation; for independence. These divisions may be along racial, tribal, historical, political or religious lines: sometimes all of these things inextricably bound up together. And they result in bitterness, hatred and violence.

Surely it is a fundamental part of our humanity that we thrive best in community? Surely we are better together? Surely we should be breaking down barriers, not building them? Uniting, not dividing?

Part of our very humanness is sharing knowledge; sharing resources; sharing lives. We read that the first Christians 'were one in heart and mind. No-one claimed that any of his possessions was his own, but they shared everything they had.' [Acts 4:32]

Yet, in spite of that, when we look into the early church, through the lens of the New Testament, we see groups of believers struggling with division and fragmentation – Jewish Christians against Gentile Christians; groups polarising around different leaders. Much of the New Testament, particularly in the letters to these infant churches, is a plea for unity – that we are better together.

St. Paul likens the church to a body with each part needing the other and no part being able to function alone. The New Testament appeals to us to love, honour, respect, encourage, serve, and forgive one another. To live in peace with one another.

Admittedly the church historically has not always lived up to these high ideals – and probably still doesn't – but the challenge remains with us today, especially to those of us who are seeking to follow Jesus. Our present society is marred in so many ways by division and fragmentation, often resulting in loneliness and isolation; in non-communication and disconnection. We need to work at creating communities where people can find support and friendship, honesty and compassion, openness and trust. The churches need to be at the heart of such communities working alongside each other, and alongside other individuals and organisations. We are better together!

At RE:NEW we are trying to build a community in which everyone can find togetherness and acceptance, and feel part of something much bigger than themselves. Why not come and join us? Peter Wells

War Detectives

A PROJECT OF RED2GREEN

Remembering the 70th Anniversary of the end of World War 2 and the impact on the local community

Do you, or any of your relatives or friends have stories to tell about the Second World War or 'memories' or artefacts you might have inherited or have access to?

We need these to help us go on a year-long journey together with the local community, ending with a commemoration of the end of the Second World War, which has its 70th Anniversary next summer 2015.

Would you also like to take part in some of the activities and events we have planned. either as a participant or a volunteer?

For example please come to our first Community Learning Day focussing on 'Swaffham Bulbeck's War' from 10.30am to 2.30pm on Thursday October 9th 2014 at Red2Green. If so please let us know you are coming – see contact details at the end of this article.

Red2Green have been successful again in securing funding from the Heritage Lottery Fund, this time 'to carry out a year-long programme of activities exploring the Second World War and its impact on the village of Swaffham Bulbeck'. These activities will bring together Red2Green's adults with autism, adults with learning disabilities, school children from Swaffham Bulbeck Primary School and Bottisham Village College, and local people, and will include:

- 5 Community Learning Days at Red2Green focussing on Swaffham Bulbeck's War (October 9th 2014), Rations (12th January 2015), Codes (10th February), Lies and Spies (22nd April), and Fashion (21st May)
- Visits to both Duxford Imperial War Museum (10th to 13th November inclusive) and Bletchley Park (16th to 19th March 2015 inclusive)
- Opportunities to record oral and video histories of local people's experiences of the war (over 5 days in late November and early December 2014), and share these (and other discoveries) at a
- Commemoration event planned for 10th June 2015 which will include the burying of a time capsule.

WINTER is coming and after seeing a rise in chimney fires last year, Cambridgeshire Fire and Rescue Service is encouraging all residents to get their chimney professionally swept before the cold sets in.

Top tips to enjoy an open fire safely:

- Sweep your chimney at least once a year and get brickwork inspected, especially the chimney breast and roof space.
- Do not bank fires too high or overload the grate, and remember to let them burn down well and check the hearth before going to bed.
- Use a fire or spark guard to prevent accidental fires.
- Do not place objects on or over the mantle-piece which may cause you to stand too close to the fire to reach or use them.
- Burn only suitable fuels and avoid burning resinous woods as soot builds up quickly.
- Above all, ensure you have a working smoke alarm fitted on each floor or your home

Importantly, please ensure that you have a **working** smoke alarm fitted to the highest point of each floor of your home. These should be **tested** regularly – ideally each month both to ensure that they work (they may require new batteries) and to maximise their effectiveness. To find out if you are eligible for a free home fire safety check, call 0800 917 99 94.



Parish Council Report

After meeting with a representative from David Wilson Homes regarding various issues of maintenance with the footpath around the moat, we are still waiting for a response. Also we have still not got a date from the landowner for moving the kissing gate near the path through Ancient Meadows but have been assured this will be done once harvesting is finished for the year. Since the meeting the County Council have informed us that the traffic calming installation will begin week beginning 15th September so hopefully it will be well underway by the time of reading. The County Council are carrying out a consultation on budget restrictions and are inviting residents to have their say. The survey can be accessed on the County Council website at www.cambridgeshire.gov.uk/budgetconsultation

We have received £353.84 from the two electrical recycling collections in the village and another will be taking place on Thursday 4th December. There was discussion about possible uses for this money ranging from a revised village website to planting for The Triangle, although it was agreed that more frequent cutting of the grass in this area could make it look tidier overall.

The Clerk had received a copy of the letter that Mr Alf Laister sent to the Cresset and had replied saying that negotiations with the National Trust are at an early stage and there are no proper plans for the site at present. Cllr Bryant reminded councillors at the September meeting that the land is being purchased primarily for provision of a new cemetery and that any other uses of the site, such as for a play area or additional allotments, could be considered once the site is in the ownership of the Parish Council.

Cllr Altham said that the National Trust cannot sell the land off of Lode Road to the Parish Council but would encourage us to compulsorily purchase the site. The Parish Council have spent considerable time looking at possible sites within and around the village to identify a site that would be suitable as many potential areas are affected by drainage and watercourses. It was agreed that Parish Council would contact the District Valuer's office to find out the cost of purchasing the land.

The Chair brought Tony Jolley's article in last months Cresset to the attention of councillors and encouraged them to read it as some had not yet received their copy by the date of the September meeting (1st). It was agreed this would be discussed at the next meeting.

Bottisham And District Gardening Club

Philip Whaites Head Gardener of Wimpole Hall showed slides and explained how he has masterminded the recreation of the magnificent gardens surrounding the house since he started work there in 1981.

He and his team of 3 gardeners and a volunteer group of over a hundred have restored the Pleasure Gardens with daffodils, bluebells and a wild flower area with bee and spotted orchids and are currently constructing new paths.

The Floral gardens include the Parterre garden which is best viewed from the first floor of the Hall and these have been restored to as it was in Victorian times with 6,000 box plants to form the hedges and filled with 10,000 bedding plants (red geraniums and blue salvias) all grown on site from seed. Latterly some of the beds have been filled with small shrubs to save bedding out plants but these of course need trimming.

Most recently the walled garden has been restored with apricots trained on the walls, an herbaceous border and with many David Austin roses planted in specially prepared beds. The green houses have been repaired. Well worth a visit in any season. There are many lovely trees in the grounds too.





Public Transport Matters

Having, obviously!, an interest in public transport I was interested to read in The Times an obituary of Werner Franz. He was the last surviving member of the crew of the Hindenburg airship which caught fire in 1937 as it approached the mooring mast at the Lakehurst naval station in New Jersey after a 3-day flight from Frankfurt. He was a 14-year old cabin boy and had already flown to Rio de Janeiro, a 12-day round trip, and also Brazil, when he had passed the sister airship, the Graf Zeppelin, at midnight in the middle of the South Atlantic. I travelled to Canada in 1953 by Cunard liner – now you can even connect to America and Canada from Marshall's airport! How developments have speeded things up.

The new charging method at the Park and Ride sites continues to be a subject of concern in the letters page of the Cambridge News. Local people too are affected and contributing to the debate – some are using the local buses but for some that isn't practicable. The website parkatmyhouse.com has Cambridge addresses. Sadly on the day that my own letter was published – citing the rural buses and 'Use it or Lose it' as you never know when you might no longer be able to drive - my younger son fell and broke his wrist. Needing to commute to London from a village with a very poor bus service has proved difficult. The Dartford crossing method of payment by throwing a coin in a collection box has been quoted but that is due to change from October 14th to the Dart Charge – a remote payment method by telephone or gadget.

Kindness to us dithering oldies is always appreciated – we took the 727 National Express coach to Norwich from Newmarket. We do not know Norwich well and were hunting Jarrolds in the centre of town. We checked with the local bus driver that we should alight at the first stop, alighted and then stood wondering in which direction we should go. The cheerful driver then alighted and informed us that if we went downstairs and out of the back door of Boots, by which we were standing, we were nearly there! The returning coach was cancelled due to a fault so we had a half hour wait but were relieved to be back in Newmarket just in time to connect to the no. 11 at 6.10. We had noticed when waiting for the coach in Newmarket that the shelter no longer had information about National Express services – the 727 and 490. Indeed on the stop sign by Hughes there is just a broken part of a sign saying 'al' – presumably the former National Express one. I contacted National Express regarding this and they have replied with thanks and are getting it organised. I also pointed out that we were only at the Newmarket stop because they have refused to allow us to hail the 727 on the A1303 at the Bottisham stop. It is again being considered for future review.

Having local bus knowledge can be useful – returning from an afternoon in Bury St. Edmunds there was again a cancelled bus (this is usually quite rare!). We saw the 16 to Newmarket through the villages awaiting passengers and told people near us in the long queue that we were going to take that route instead. A pleasant ride back through the Fornhams, Red Lodge, Mildenhall, Kennett and Kentford was enjoyed. We waited just a few minutes at Newmarket Bus Station and then were joined by all the people on the replacement bus who told us of their long wait standing in the queue!

The Bottisham surgery dispensary – an individuals view

I read with interest that the surgery will welcome Beverley Weller-Lewis as the new Manager for the Dispensary. I also read that there is an acknowledgement that the dispensary has been under some pressure for several months.

It's hard for me to understand how the Dispensary can justify the waiting time of 48 hours or more if over the weekend for a repeat prescription. Most of the time the medicines what you require are on the shelf behind them why can't they simply pick them off and give them to you. Because of the competition in Pharmacies these days this is what they do with some even delivering them to your home for free.

I understand in some circumstances a Doctor may need to be consulted and 48 hours is not unreasonable in these instances.

The normal repeat prescription should be immediate, yes I repeat you go to the counter and get it straight away like any other product.

If this is not possible then a reason why would be welcome, we get lots of information informing us of the dispensing times and the need for us as the customer to be patient, such a request would be unthinkable in a retail shop, but we get no valid reason as to why it takes longer to get your prescription from our surgery than anywhere else.

In the current climate business is consistently re-looking at service levels to its customers and monitoring its staffs productivity with a view to giving improved service to their customers and our Surgery's Dispensary should be no different.



Thoughts of a Sports Nut

This edition found your scribe sitting in the sunshine outside a bar in Münsterplatz, opposite the beautiful cathedral in Basel, in something of a reflective mood. But it wasn't the impending Switzerland v England Euro 2016 qualifier I was contemplating; the idle chatter of friends over a beer brought me closer to home, thinking of absent friends.

We have sadly lost a couple of local stalwarts of our community recently, two remarkable gentlemen who I had the privilege of knowing mainly through the sporting family. I'm sure everyone will join me in offering heartfelt condolences to their respective families and friends.

Firstly there was Harry Boal, bona fide WWII hero, entrepreneur, sportsman and Derby County fan. Having narrowly avoided an ill-fated RAF mission to Germany in 1944, Harry possessed an enviable joie de vivre and proved an outstanding companion, whether frustrating you on the snooker table, joining the lads on a charity bike ride, or tramping through Hitler's back yard at the Kehlsteinhaus en route to the Munich Oktoberfest. I will never forget Harry telling a new German friend in Munich that this was his first visit to Germany with a passport! A life well lived... Harry we miss you!

I knew Gordon Brown less well, but the former coal merchant, accountant, businessman and multi-talented sportsman was highly respected in the local villages, particularly in the football world, having run the Swaffham Sunday side for a number of years. Another life well lived. One of his last acts was to support his Veterans team at the Nifty Cornell charity football tournament at Lode Fassage at the end of August, and one hopes that future events will remember and celebrate the life of Gordon as well as Nifty, both having been taken way too early.

Perhaps it was the return to competitive football, perhaps it was the easy-going nature of the Swiss, or the wonderful, clean, cultured atmosphere of Basel, but – whatever it was – we couldn't wait to see what Roy Hodgson's new blend of youth and experience, captained by a suddenly matured Rooney, would produce. (Did anyone notice Rooney's TV interview after the announcement of his captaincy? Elocution lessons, methinks! Credit where it's due – well done Wayne!)

Well, England played with heart and verve and determination and were a proper 'team' for a change. We hardly had the nerve to tell them we were walking between bars at the time!

The Commonwealth or Commonwealth of Nations is essentially a group of 53 countries formed from the old British Empire who, despite de colonisation and independence from the 'mother country', wish to remain united primarily in language and in a set of shared values involving democracy, human rights and most importantly the rule of law. None of these countries has been obliged to be part of the Commonwealth – it's of their choosing, and in all cases the foundation of their written constitutions can be found in Magna Carta. Our Queen is the head of the Commonwealth and is also Monarch to 15 other Commonwealth countries in addition to England. Until Britain joined the EU trading bloc you could add to the above list of attributes trade affiliations.

Of course the most recognised characteristics of the Commonwealth are the Commonwealth Games and the Commonwealth Heads of Government legislature. But it also comprises the Commonwealth War Graves Commission, the Commonwealth of Learning and the Commonwealth Business Commission to list but a few.

If you're following these 'Jolley Old World' articles you have no doubt read in previous submissions my references to matters and all things quintessentially English or British – sport is no exception. And many would argue that Britain has invented and provided the rules for the most popular sports played around the world.

Indeed research has shown that many Commonwealth nations play similar that are considered quintessentially "British" in character, rooted in and developed under British rule or authority, including , , , and . This has led to the development of friendly national rivalries between the main sporting nations of the Commonwealth that have often defined their relations with one another outside of sport. Undeniably these rivalries have preserved close ties even as the Empire transformed into the Commonwealth. Playing these sports is seen to be a sign of sharing a certain Commonwealth culture; the adoption of is seen as symbolic of the country's chosen move towards Commonwealth membership. But not only this – some of the lesser developed countries of the Commonwealth (Jolley continued on page 57.)

would not be able to generate sportsmen and women capable of Olympic competition if it were not for the opportunities and financial support presented to them by participating in the Commonwealth Games.

The 'Games' in particular has produced many medal winners from the lesser developed nations that have gone on to become Olympic medallists and champions. These triumphs have thus surely bolstered world recognition not only for the medal winners themselves but also for their countries. Equally it will have elevated the self believe, aspirations and esteem of their fellow countrymen. But have we forgotten that, and should we be thankful for, the close ties between Commonwealth nations in providing a stabilising influence amongst these nations' relationships globally. This steadying influence is achieved through a 'Charter' which brings together the values and aspirations of democracy, human rights and the rule of law which unite the Commonwealth.

The 'Charter' expresses the commitment of member states to the development of free and democratic societies and the promotion of peace and prosperity to improve the lives of all peoples of the Commonwealth - of greater importance now than ever before with the threat of 'extremism' coming from a number of quarters and on the very doorstep of many of the developing Commonwealth countries. The Charter also acknowledges the role of civil society in supporting the goals and values of the Commonwealth whose policies are shaped individually and collectively by the member countries.

Nonetheless and to conclude on a slightly more cynical note, some would suggest that if the UK ever left the EU it would to turn to the Commonwealth in an endeavour to restore a trading alliance - a growing market covering 25% of the world and a third of its population generating 17% plus of world Gross Domestic Product (GDP).

So 'Sports Nut' aka GD – no! I don't think I can agree that the Commonwealth is an anachronism – not just yet anyway. **What better cause than these!**TJ



Bottisham Patients' Group

On September 9th Bottisham Medical Practice welcomed Care Quality Commission (CQC) inspectors to the surgery as part of a pilot project to inform the inspection of GPs' practice which will commence formally in England this month. During the day the inspectors spent with the doctors, nurses and Practice staff, the Inspection Team Manager interviewed the Patients' Group's Chair and Secretary. She questioned us in a friendly way for one and a half hours, listening attentively to our answers, noting our comments in detail, and encouraging us to share the PG's views about how patient participation can be enhanced to benefit patients more. The full report of the inspection will be published in three to six weeks' time and will be available at the surgery and on the Practice's website: www.bottishammedicalpractice.nhs.uk.

- **Heart Start session** This session on 13th September, offered by the British Heart Foundation to help people learn how to cope with life-threatening situations, was postponed for lack of interest. We plan to offer it again after Christmas.
- 'Flu Clinics Yes, it's that time of year again! If you are over the age of 65 or are in the clinical 'at risk' groups, i.e. have a chronic health condition or are pregnant, you are recommended to have a 'flu jab every year. Bottisham surgery will be open to give you your jab on:

Saturday 11th October and Saturday 25th October from 9.00 am to 1.00 pm Make your appointment by phoning 01223 810030 or calling at the surgery. More 'flu clinics will be offered during normal surgery hours. 'Flu immunisation is offered to all children aged 2, 3 and 4 on the 01.09.2014 (but not aged under 2 or over 5). It is a one-dose nasal spray and parents/carers will be contacted by the Practice to invite their children to come and receive their vaccination. 'At risk' children need a second dose at least 4 weeks after the first. Children aged 2–17 years who are in the clinical 'at risk' groups, will also receive the nasal 'flu vaccine instead of the flu jab. 'At risk' children aged 6 months to 2 years will continue to receive the annual 'flu jab. More information is on www.nhs.uk/Conditions/vaccinations/Pages/who-should-have-flu-vaccine.aspx.


