The Bottisham Bells

It was a pleasure to welcome such a good turnout to the Launch Day for the Bell Restoration Project on 9 May. It was even more of a pleasure for those of us involved on the organising side that same number who started the trip up the tower to see the bells arrived safely back on terra firma again. Those who did make the trip will have seen for themselves that the preparatory works that we outlined in the last issue of Cresset have all been completed. There are now two steel beams in the belfry above the two lines of bells to aid lifting, another steel in the ringing chamber under the clock-chamber floor, and a new floor in the belfry. Getting the two sections of the steel beams (1/3rd and 2/3rds of the length) high up in the belfry was no mean feat, let alone then managing to insert them into opposite pockets in the tower walls and bolt them together - exciting viewing. The next key date is Monday 8 June, when Nicholsons arrive to remove the six bells from the tower. They estimate that it will take them 3 days to do this and that they will be taken back to their works in Bridport, Dorset, on the Thursday morning. This is not a trivial job, but they exude an air of confidence, well-practiced as they are in this activity, that they will keep to this timetable. All being well, there should then be a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to view the bells without having to climb any stairs or ladders. Watch that space!

And before then, don't forget the Trinity Fair/Church Fete on Saturday 6 June in the church and churchyard, 2 to 4 pm!

East Camb District Councillor's Notes

These are my last notes after eight years as a District Councillor, as I decided not to stand for reelection. I should like to thank everyone and give my best wishes for their future. Kevin Ellis has moved to Suffolk so could not stand again.

CRYSTAL STRUCTURES SITE •• The Council has now given full planning permission for this development. There will be nine affordable homes for shared ownership or for rent for those with local connections, and fifteen homes for sale on the open market.

There is also outline permission for 600 square metres of land for non-domestic institution or business employment use. This follows completion of a legal agreement for the provision of the affordable homes and off-site open space provision and maintenance. An Appeal against the refusal of a previous application has been withdrawn.

LOCAL PLAN •• The Council has finally passed its Local Plan. This will be its new planning policy that will apply in East Cambridgeshire and guide planners and potential applicants.

RECYCLING •• The District has received Government funding to encourage more recycling by giving prizes to households putting blue bin materials out for collection.

54 prizes ranging from £10 to £250 will be given each month. Parishes will be surveyed at least every five collections and at random. Households not putting recycling out will not be eligible and will receive a leaflet through the letterbox. There will also be checks for content. The scheme will run for two years but could continue, financed from credits for increased recycling from the Government. We have also been given a Golden Carton Award for our much improved recycling of cartons.

COMMUNITY INFRASTRUCTURE LEVY FUNDING •• Following consultation with Parishes, the District Council has added several projects to the list of those it would help fund from levies on new developments throughout the District. Formerly the list only covered large projects in Ely, Littleport and Soham. Four projects have been added which includes the Lode-Quy Cycle Path, following a submission from Lode Parish Council. This project has been agreed by the County Council, financed from Government funds, but hopefully will stay on the District list should there be a problem with funds from this source.

LODE SOCIAL CLUB BUILDING •• Following a visit in April, the Planning Committee met to determine the application for alterations and extensions to the building. Following a previous objection from County Highways on parking and traffic safety implications of more intensive staffing and use, the agent for the applicant had then formally stated that the premises would be run in a similar way as before. The agent and a neighbour spoke, and questions were put to them and the officer. The agent confirmed that the building would be used as a social club for members. The committee discussed parking and viability issues and I said that the club committee, its members and those responding to the application, had expected the premises to be used as a pub and restaurant.

It was explained by the planning officer that if it were to be so, it would require another application. The committee approved the application for the alterations and extensions, subject to conditions covering the parking and manoeuvring layout, external venting (needing a further application), noise, hours, deliveries, collections and bin storage etc. Please note that, despite a report elsewhere, there has never been an application for a change of use of the premises, or mention of a pub or restaurant in the application. There was, however a separate application to determine its lawful use, which was established by the Council to be a Social Club.

Parish Notes

First business on the agenda at Parish Council's May meeting was to elect a Chair. There were 2 nominations for this role and after a vote Councillor Christine Bryant was declared the Chair for the next term. Vice Chair will be Councillor Jon Ogborn. We welcomed 3 new parish councillors. They are Sarah Brown who lives in Beechwood Avenue, Julia Latif, also of Beechwood Avenue and Roman Maczkiewicz of Peacock Drive. 

Don't talk about religion or politics!

I am writing this just after the General Election. The result has been a shock to almost everyone. Some people are jubilant, others are devastated. The full implications of what has happened will take time to become clear.

Mark Twain wrote: "Whenever you find yourself on the side of the majority, it is time to

pause and reflect."

Our hope must be that all our politicians and the parties they represent will take that time to pause and reflect. But also that we will all take time to reflect on what has happened, and what it is going to mean for our future. As many commentators have said, the political map of the UK has dramatically changed.

There is a passage in one of Paul's letters in the New Testament which reads: 'I urge, then, first of all, that requests, prayers, intercession and thanksgiving be made for everyone - for kings and all those in authority, that we may live peaceful and quiet lives in all godliness and holiness. This is good, and pleases God our Saviour...' [1 Timothy 2:1-3]

I take this to mean that as Christians we should be praying for justice, truth, fairness, respect and integrity from our political leaders, not for a quiet, undisturbed life for ourselves. We should be disturbed whenever we come across injustice, poverty, corruption, abuse and all the other things which are a blight on our society today. It is worth remembering that Paul wrote those words whilst living under the brutal military dictatorship of the Roman Caesars, at a time when Christians were experiencing severe persecution, and only three or four years before he himself was beheaded in Rome during the reign of the Emperor Nero.

Jesus himself often disturbed people. He challenged the status quo. He was angered by the hypocrisy and complacency he saw in the religious leaders of his day. His call to his followers was to help establish a different kind of society, based on righteousness, justice, love and compassion. He called it the kingdom of God, but it was meant to be established here in the world.

Bishop Desmond Tutu once famously stated: "When people say that the Bible and

politics don't mix, I ask them which Bible they are reading".

The Jesus manifesto is a manifesto for change. A change of attitude, a changed way of life, a changed way of thinking, a changed way of looking at the world. If we are going to change society, we can't just leave it to the politicians! The changes we need to see won't come about through laws and Acts of Parliament. It is hearts, minds and lives that have to be changed. One by one, person by person. Caring for one another; helping those less fortunate than ourselves; loving our neighbours; giving and forgiving. Christians, the church, need to be modelling this transformed way life, this new society. Looking outward, not inward. Sadly, if we're honest, we don't always succeed, but we continue to try, and with God's help we will one day see His kingdom come.



We have just had a happy example of this situation. A friend of mine - since we were 9 years old and had arrived back at Leigh-on-Sea in 1945 after the end of the war in Europe - has sadly been widowed. Due to her husband's work for a British company in France they have lived in that country for 28 years and she now considers it her main home. A problem she has just faced was that they previously did their tours of family and friends in the UK by car but she no longer felt able to do that. We used to enjoy taking the X5 and meeting them for lunch in the Old Bridge Hotel, Huntingdon. So this year we had a couple of phone calls from our friend as she battled with British railway timetables and tried to fit us all in in a sensible fashion. Finally we heard that we had been allocated one hour from 11 a.m. at King's Cross station as she travelled across from Paddington and then would leave for another friend in Knebworth. The phrase used to be 'meet me under the clock' but our commuter-son suggested M & S at King's Cross would be easily seen as she came in from the taxi rank. Mobile phones proved useful as at 11.10 a.m. as we discovered that, being unfamiliar for so many years with railway stations in London, she was actually outside M & S in St. Pancras station. Soon happily reunited and refreshed after coffee we then discovered that the train for Knebworth was, in fact, the slow train to Cambridge so we had further time together.

Discussions on an upgrade of Newmarket railway station continue but Kennett is to have a £500,000 range of improvements funded by Abellio Greater Anglia – resurfacing of platforms, replacing slabs at the platform edge, new waiting shelters on both platforms and cycle parking hoops. Abellio Greater Anglia are sponsors of the Eastern Angles drama group based in Ipswich – they travel the region putting on shows in local community facilities and we like to visit them when they are in Haverhill. There is a bus link via Cambridge but of, course, we no longer have the late evening return bus from Cambridge.

The problem of congestion in Cambridge continues to get worse and we hope that the new councillors (results coming in as I write this) and M.P.s (welcome Lucy!) can give this problem some consideration – we took a taxi to the railway station recently at 5 p.m. thinking it would be quicker than the buses but we were stuck in traffic for an hour. Perhaps if more people could consider bus use and bus routes were better planned, things could improve. Tunnels, trams, cable cars and other forms of travel are all suggested.

The Department of Transport has been running an international competition led by the FutureRailway programme team to develop designs for a new generation of passenger rolling stock. 42 Technology of St. Ives is named as one of 3 winning companies – carriages that can be reconfigured to carry passengers or freight according to occupancy levels – commuter trains returning to the suburbs could take freight. Seats can be moved and stowed.

There is much competition for orders amongst train building companies. Derby based Bombadier has the order from the govt. for Crossrail trains having lost out previously to German company Siemens. A Scotrail tender has been lost to Hitachi, Alstom of France and CAF of Spain are in the game and CAF has won the order for the Caledonian Sleeper rolling stock. And now the Chinese train builders are taking an interest. Bombadier is exploring ways of running electric trains on unelectrified lines using the energy stored in the on-train batteries – Liverpool St. to Manningtree and then branching off to the port of Harwich. German owned bus and train operator Arriva has seen a 7.4 p.c. rise in annual sales. Let's hope Stagecoach can afford some newer local buses! (Public Transport Matters continued on page 37.)





Moores two days before Moores himself was told. I hold no candle for Moores who, in my opinion, was way out of his depth at international level in his second term as coach, having failed to get the best from the talent at his disposal in successive one-day and five-day competitions. I only hope that his replacement is not some ambitious Aussie (e.g. Jason Gillespie and Justin Langer are already bookies' favourites) looking for a stepping stone to a 'real' job in his home country... I don't see much strategic thinking in that.

So what of Pietersen then? For all his underhanded protestations and lobbying for England to play its 'best' eleven (smugly aided and abetted by the odious Piers Morgan), KP has been a maverick, controversial and divisive influence wherever he's been in the past and there is precious little evidence that he's outgrown the self-centred, attention-seeking, irascible, unpredictable and unreliable aspects of his complex personality. He burned his boats long ago with his South African texting odyssey and his abrasive autobiography and, at 35, he's hardly one for the future anyway, methinks. He should remember that cricket is a TEAM game.

Hopefully, Andrew Strauss will bring some sense to this unholy mess soon. I remember sitting at Lords in 2004 with a certain other Cresset scribe watching Strauss make a gritty, obdurate century on his England test debut. TJ and I agreed immediately this was a man of substance. Let's pray that he proves it again this summer.

It officially closes at the end of June so if you're still interested in putting forward your (anonymous) point of view you can still access the questionnaire by typing the following into the address bar of your browser: www.surveymonkey.com/s/w5km93n So far there's a consensus for a 'forum' to organise 'wide-ranging village activities' that fall outside of the remit of those clubs and societies with a specific focus. But what is meant by 'wide-ranging village activities'? When this question was recently put to a few others they immediately referred to the lack of celebration to commemorate St George's Day and VE Day as examples of where village organisations could to be brought together. They cited a few villages around us that did put on some form of rejoicing for at least one of these important events. Indeed a group of us from Bottisham went to an excellent VE 'Big Band' celebration and war time supper in the newly built Isleham Community Centre - we marvelled at the achievement of the community there. If these sorts of events are something you identify with for Bottisham then please do put your comments forward by responding to the questionnaire mentioned above.

You will probably have heard that our Parish Council was elected unopposed and that there will be some new faces sitting on the Council as from the first PC meeting in May. Good news indeed for no matter how committed Councillors are aspirations can go stale and longevity of community service can instil complacency. This is also the time when Councillors elect officers from within their ranks such as Chair, Vice Chair, etc. I'm sure we all wish them well and at the same time offer them much encouragement to proactively get on with the tasks ahead during their custodianship of our village. There are those amongst us that believe an immense amount of toil will need to be given to heal the wounds that overdevelopment has inflicted on our rural infrastructure and social wellbeing. This can only be achieved by communicating with the community and by carrying out the wishes of the community without diluting the necessary fervour with personal agendas. Parish Council has a good website; www.bottishampc.org.uk which allows it to disseminate information into the community in-between meetings. The website also offers the facility for polls to be taken on important matters affecting the village. Just an idea but perhaps each Councillor should produce a list of three things that to their mind are priorities for the village and from these lists PC agree an 'action programme'. A 'champion' to be nominated for each priority and each 'champion' to publish a blog on the PC Website and in the Cresset...

You may recall that I was seeking to find out why the Bottisham S106 levy on developers put aside for Community Infrastructure (CI) projects cannot be used to acquire new land for outdoor playing space. After some extraordinary yet interesting conversations with various parties I have to admit to losing the battle - so far! The unvielding position of East Cambs is that new outdoor playing space is considered by them to be Public Open Space (POS) not CI and therefore cannot be funded from the CI pot. Conversely the National Playing Fields Association (NPFA) doesn't regard 'outdoor playing space' to be the same as POS, and neither does Play England – the latter specifically referring to 'outdoor playing space' as being part of CI in the context of S106. It was interesting that a 'sympathetic' officer at East Cambs directed me to East Cambs own Play Audit conducted in 2012/13 that revealed Bottisham was (and still is) deficient by some 25 or so acres for recreational purposes. Personally I can't think of a single amenity this village has gained from S106 monies for absorbing new housing. If it's known that the village is deficient in so much outdoor playing space why isn't this being considered when S106 agreements with developers are being set up? It does seem on the face of it that our District Council is seriously out of step with the policy makers on 'outdoor playing space' and perhaps this is an issue our new District Councillors would like to pursue? On an indirectly related topic no wonder the number of new houses to be built around Cambridge is being overstated. According to our local press those that are being built are being bought up by foreign investors - I think many of us have known this for some time. Anyway, the unscrupulous practices of 'buy to leave' and 'buy to let' are matters our newly elected MPs and Councillors should be encouraged to raise at the highest level.

And so as I write the country has spoken and party politics has been given a good firm kick up the backside. But of course we still have those minority parties crying 'foul' about the 'first past the post' electoral system. Proportional Representation (PR) does nothing for me – what is the point of splitting the 650 seats based on percentage of vote achieved by each party. As it stands each constituency votes for the candidate and or party they feel will best serve them. The winner based on votes counted then goes on to take his or her seat in the British Parliament. The party with the most bums on seats forms the Government – all quite proper and sensible, in my opinion! Slim though it may be we now have a majority Conservative Government which suggests the nation in general has subscribed to the notion that a prosperous Britain requires a strong and healthy economy.

Bottisham Medical Practice Patients' Group

At their **AGM** on 23 April Chairman Sylvia Thomson gave her report on the year's activities, this will be on the Practice website. She then presented Dr Higham with an Ambulatory Blood Pressure Monitor purchased by a grateful patient following the fund raising initiative carried out by the Patients Group. Further equipment will be purchased with the Red Bucket money.

Dr Rashid then gave an enthusiastic presentation to those present on "The Mediterranean Diet – could it help you live longer". This diet is based on the way Mediterranean villagers ate in the 1950s and 1960s and not on modern day Italian dishes. Research has proved that incidence of heart disease, stroke, cancer, Parkinsons Disease and Alzheimers is reduced in those following the diet. Fish, olive oil, pulses, nuts, wholegrains, using herbs and spices instead of salt, lots of fruit and vegetables and also enjoying meals together are the basis of this diet. Website "How to Follow the Mediterranean Diet" www.patient.co.uk/health/howto-follow-the-mediterranean-diet provides useful information.

Uniting Care Partnership: Andrea Grosbois gave a talk on the NHS Uniting Care Partnership (UCP) (made up of Addenbrooke's Hospital and Cambridgeshire and Peterborough Foundation Trust) which is now responsible for providing all older people's healthcare and adult community services throughout Cambridgeshire and Peterborough.

This means that care in the community will be delivered by integrated teams of mental health, physical health and community health professionals working together for one organization. The aim is to treat older people in their own homes as much as possible and avoid unnecessary hospital admissions. There will be a smooth transition and new services include a 24/7 helpline and community emergency teams. These will respond within two hours and can provide overnight support if necessary. The care will be organized around Neighbourhood Teams based on groupings of GP practices so the community teams can more easily get to know the needs of the people they are caring for and can co-ordinate more effectively with health and social care colleagues. You can contact UCP on unitingcare@cpft.nhs.uk or 01223 726774. Leaflets are also available in Bottisham Surgery.

As Sylvia Thomson then retired from the committee a new chairman, Steve Gilson was elected. She was thanked for her hard work over the last 3 years. There were no other changes on the committee, full details of which will be on the Practice's website as soon as possible. 

The Darling Family Marathon Challenge

Last October both Chris and Sophie ran in the Peterborough half marathon and achieved championship qualifying times for the London marathon and this gave us the idea that the whole family should take up the challenge to run a marathon. Julia and I missed out on the London marathon ballot (you have around a 1 in 8 change of getting in) so we decided to enter the Manchester marathon, a week before London.

The long hard training plan started around Christmas time and we all had injury setbacks from time to time but there was a determination that none of us wanted to let the rest of the family down. I can assure you that if you want to run a marathon in a decent time the training is punishing. We all ran in a 20 mile road race at Wymondham in March. This was a very good test which went very well for us all, with Chris winning the race.

On the 18th of April we all went to stay in Salford Quays, Manchester in preparation for the race the following day. Race day came and we made our way to Old Trafford for the start of the race and I must admit we were extremely nervous. The race itself was a fantastic experience with tremendous support from the people of Manchester, Altringham, Salford and all the surrounding areas. It really helped both Julia and myself as 26.2 miles is a very long way to run. We both had tough times in the last 4 miles or so but seeing Old Trafford in the distance spurred us to the finish line in Sir Matt Busby Way. I finished in a time of 4 hours 6 minutes which was way above my expectations and if you could have told Hum, Dod and Digger that I could run that far in such a time 30 years ago they would have rolled about laughing. Julia finished in a time of 4 hours 31 mins which was a fantastic time for her first marathon run. Chris and Sophie kept popping up and down the Metro line to find places to support us. It was a great day.

The following week it was Chris and Sophie's turn and we went down to London on the Saturday before where the excitement around the event was electric. We went to the Expo Centre to collect their numbers and chips and stayed in Greenwich the night before to prepare. In the morning Chris and Sophie went to the start both excited and confident. The race had an amazing atmosphere and we saw Chris and Sophie at the 5 mile mark both going very well. Then I received a couple of texts to say Chris was on TV running with Paula Radcliffe, chatting with a fellow competitor. We then saw them both again at the 23 mile mark; both were digging deep and looked to be struggling. They both managed to push on and finish in remarkable times. Chris finished in 2 hours 35 minutes which now ranks him number 1 in the UK for his age category. In fact it looks like it's the quickest time by a 20 year old for around 10 years. He was also pleased that he finished in front of Paula Radcliffe. Sophie finished her first marathon run in 3 hours 15 minutes which ranks her 7th in the UK for her age category. This was a tremendous achievement for her after suffering last year from an achilles injury that impaired her training schedule.

It was an amazing 2 weeks for our family and an experience we will never forget.

The next challenge is for Chris and Sophie who are both representing GB in the European Aquathlon Age Group Championships in Cologne in June. That is a lake swim followed by a run. Many thanks to all the people who sponsored us. We have raised in the region of £1,700 for Arthur Rank House, in memory of my mother.

Also, many thanks to the staff and coaches at Bottisham Village College, Hills Road Sixth Form College and Cambridge Triathlon Club who inspired Chris and Sophie to take up running and compete at the highest level they can.

David White's talk was entitled "A Packet of Parsley". Not a talk about herbs with growing tips and ideas for their use but a talk about his interest and love of gardening. He enjoyed watching both his grandfather and father maintain excellent gardens and as he grew older was able to help. Aged 6 he was given a small area to use as HIS garden prepared the ground and set his packet of parsley. He sold the crop to the local butcher for his window display, sales there improved and he was invited to start as a delivery boy with them once he left school. He worked at weekends cutting lawns (over 30 of them) and gardening for a Czech Jewish refugee.

He was fortunate in 1971 to gain an apprenticeship with the Royal Parks at £11 per week. He had many stories from his time at Buckingham Palace, Clarence House and the rear gardens of Downing St. This led to training at Kew Gardens a three year intensive course to degree level – not bad for a boy from a council home whose school report noted "that he would succeed in life as long as there was some involvement with horticulture". He eventually worked for the Department of Transport with responsibility for roadside tree planting. He disliked the travelling involved and being apart from his young family and with the financial backing from his Czech refugee employer and friend he was able to buy a garden centre near Chatteris. This was sold after 30 years and he now runs with his wife a travel and training company and also resources and sells plants. He had brought several unusual plants for sale. Mr White was an amusing speaker with an interesting tale to tell.

We are on the road for the next few months – on June 10th members will have an evening visit to Abbotts Way gardens in Horningsea with a tour and refreshments. We have a coach outing planned for July to Castle Ashby, Northamptonshire and more details will follow.
