So next time you feel like complaining about something you think is wrong in the world, perhaps think about what you might do to help.

The Rev. Sue Giles writes

The season of Lent arrives early this year and so does Easter. In the Benefice we will begin our Lenten Fast with a pancake service in Quy village hall on Sunday 14th February at 11 am and you would be very welcome to join us. Lent is not the most popular season for many people. It is often viewed as a rather gloomy penitential season associated with discipline and giving things up neither of which inspire people to get involved. There is, however, another way of looking at Lent. It can also be a time for celebrating God's love and his patience with us even when we get things wrong. Lent helps us to deepen our love for God and a Lenten discipline can create a structure to help us become more open to God and his action in the world. Lent is a time to count our blessings.

Christian Aid have produced some excellent resources for Lent which help both children and adults to recognise the blessings of their lives and to give thanks to the Giver. Each day in Lent we are invited to do simple things such as looking in the fridge, counting the variety of vegetables that are there and thanking God for the food we enjoy. There is also an option to put a small amount of money into a jar as a practical thanksgiving that Christian Aid can use to help other families around the world. Part of helping to build God's kingdom is to ensure that everyone can enjoy God's blessings as we do.

Small practical steps that help us recognise God's blessings encourage us to appreciate the ordinary things we so often take for granted. Lent this year could be a time to give thanks to God as we seek to develop an attitude of gratitude.

I wish you a happy and joyful Lent.

Parish Notes

Firstly we would like to thank Vince Campbell for all his hard work over the last 6 months in his role as District Councillor. Vince lives in Bottisham and has been proactive in the village solving problems for Parish Council and helping residents. Vince has now resigned and there is a by-election on 4th February for a new District Councillor.

You may well have noticed the new bus shelter on the High Street opposite Beechwood Avenue. Prior to Christmas the County Council let us know they were holding some S106 developer funding which was to be used to improve bus services along the High Street. As the wooden bus shelter here was quite old and needed regular maintenance we agreed that it would be a good idea to replace it with something more up-to-date that required no maintenance. We have received very positive feedback regarding the new shelter and are now looking into whether the funds could also be used to replace the bus shelter on the A1303 which is just off of the High Street. The funding is only available until mid-February so if we are able to go ahead with this, it will happen quite soon.

You will also have noticed that the new vehicle activated signs are in operation along Bell Road. This has been a long time coming but I think everyone will agree that it does slow the traffic down and make drivers think about what speed they are travelling at.

We have discussed the possibility of using traffic cones outside of the shops to control parking on the double yellow lines. The shopkeeper has now gone ahead with this as drivers have been ignoring the double yellow lines and it does seem to be having a noticeable effect, making it easier for both pedestrians and vehicles. We have had some queries from disabled drivers. To clarify, vehicles displaying a disabled badge are able to park on double yellow lines and there should still be space for them to do that with the cones in place but they must not be within 25 yards of the junction with Bell Road.

Bottisham Parish Council has applied to become a Neighbourhood Area which is the first step towards creating a Neighbourhood Plan. This is now out to consultation and details are available to view either at the library or from the Clerk. After we have been designated as a Neighbourhood Area we hope to then look at forming a Working Party including people in the village, not just parish councillors.

We submitted a pre-planning application for the new cemetery before Christmas with the District Council. We had a letter on the 23rd December confirming receipt of this and saying in principle they were supportive of the application depending on the results of various tests which we wait to hear more of.

The national 'Clean for the Queen' campaign to celebrate Her Majesty's birthday is taking place the weekend of 4-6 March. People are being encouraged to litter pick close to their home and further afield. Parish Council will be doing their bit and hope that other residents will join in. As detailed separately in the Cresset we are also linking in with the Primary School for the children to design a cover for the Cresset to inform the village about the 'Clean for the Queen' campaign.

An early date for your diaries. The Parish Council Annual Meeting has been arranged for Thursday 26th May at the Royal British Legion. All welcome.



These goods DO NOT EXIST. If it sounds too good to be true then it probably is. Safeguard yourself by carrying out a 'who is' search before committing yourself. Bottisham & District Gardening Club


We saw the old year out in style with a talk on 'Water' by Sylvia Overton, followed by the Christmas party with mulled wine and mince pies and the Christmas raffle.

He took part in the sinking of the Bismarck, patrolled the Atlantic for 2 years, and was part of the D-Day landings. He served in the Marines for 23 years, until 1960, and came to Bottisham in 1964. He was Chairman of the Gardening Club for 17 years, is currently our President and is still an active gardener, having won Best in Show for his trug of vegetables at last year's Annual Show. At the age of 96 we think he's an amazing man and we are lucky to have him on board.

RE:NEW Church Family

RELAY BATON

I've just arrived home from a very good leader's meeting at Lode chapel; the RE:NEW church family is in the middle of a phase of praying, planning and preparing for the year ahead. I had placed on each table a relay baton, I didn't even refer to it on this occasion, such was the nature of the meeting with constant discussion and contributions from those gathered; however I still think that the baton served a purpose.



The relay baton reminds me (I often carry one in my work bag, hold one when I'm praying, sometimes even when I'm preaching) that I am part of a team: God's team, and that involves running with others with the same goal, dream and vision for the race ahead. We may be different personalities, have different running styles and techniques, but we are all part of the same team. A relay team needs to know each other really well, needs to train together, needs to know who is most gifted at running which part of the race. What teams are you part of? What part do you play? What parts do others play? Do you have a shared vision, goal, hopes, dreams, aspirations? Do you genuinely love and care for one another? You cannot run a relay race alone.

People working together ultimately succeed or fail based on their commitment to one another and their shared goal.

The relay baton reminds me that when someone chooses to follow Jesus, they are entering a race, a relay, a journey of life that has a purpose, that requires us to "Go", "Reach", "Share the Good News," "Tell of what God has done in Jesus Christ". On Sunday morning 7th February we have a Believer's Baptism service (10.30am at Bottisham Primary School). Two of our young people will be baptised and will share something of their story of life, including how they came to follow Jesus and the difference He makes in their lives. I would love you to join with us. Come and hear the Good News of the Christian faith, come and see for yourself. Will you come?



Thoughts of a Sports Nut

Ever since my first introduction to business management in the 1980s, I've always liked the idea of looking back before looking forward. Review to preview, as it were. Thinking how things might move on and learning from both good and bad judgements of the past.

So what did we learn in 2015? In vaguely chronological order: we learned that drug taking in athletics is alive and kicking; that the Darlings are a formidable athletic family (without chemical assistance!); that it's possible to win the Tour de France clean (again); that Kevin Pietersen's England career is dead as the dodo; that the Aussies need to send a better team for the next Ashes series; that the best driver in the best car is nigh on unbeatable in Formula 1; that world champion cyclists Lizzie Armitstead and Peter Sagan proved that bridesmaids can sometimes be brides; that the Southern Hemisphere is still stronger half of the rugby world; that rugby referees are no longer unimpeachable; that, whilst the top footballers accumulate unimaginable wealth, adult grass-roots football is dying on its feet through a dearth of volunteers, lack of funds and a generation of 'maybe' players; that managers of all skin colours can get the sack; that, after a 'perfect 10' Euro 2016 qualifying campaign, followed by a friendly defeat in Spain, we still don't really know if England are of competitive quality; and we learned that unlimited money can buy you almost anything (such as a top football club or £5bn worth of television rights) but not immunity from embarrassment (José Mourinho) or integrity (FIFA - aaaargh!).



Public Transport Matters

As the weather turns colder, it is good to see the installation of a new bus shelter on Bottisham High St. opposite the entrance to Beechwood Ave. This has been organised by the Parish Council after the award of some funds. Stagecoach have been informed and are organising the timetables board.

I hope that your travel plans at Christmas and New Year went smoothly. Great Northern and Thameslink trains issued an apology after trains were cancelled just after Christmas in areas including Cambridge, Peterborough, King's Lynn and Bedford. They are busy training 190 new drivers. National Express ran services over the holiday period unlike the train companies. We travelled on Christmas Eve from Parkside to Stratford and were then ferried by our elder son to the Ibis Hotel at Greenwich. We stayed 2 nights and then, full of turkey and pies after a happy day with our son and family nearby, we travelled on Boxing Day back to Cambridge. No buses, of course: the taxis were busy!

Chris Elliott in his Looking Back column in the Cambridge News recently had an item from the News of 1945 saying what a joke Cambridge railway station was - this was criticism from Cambridge Town Council. LNER were asked to provide an additional platform. They knew Cambridge was famous for its ancient buildings, they said, but there was nothing more archaic than the railway station! Well, things are improving at Cambridge. Abellio Greater Anglia has completed an upgrade of the fleet of trains that operate from Cambridge to Liverpool St. 96 carriages have received new seat covers and renewed flooring, interiors resprayed and new signage. This £1m upgrade, completed ahead of time, is part of £30 million to be spent before October to improve customer service and cleanliness. Apparently the number of people using the railway in Cambridgeshire and the wider region, as released by the Office of Road and Rail suggest that 10.4 million people used the station in 2014/15 - an increase of 600,000 or 6% on the previous 12 months, making Cambridge once again the busiest station in East Anglia.

Peter Wakefield, the chairman of campaign group Rail Future East Anglia said that we need more and longer trains to cope with the situation. The new Thameslink trains will have a 1,700 capacity. There will be a respite when the new Cambridge North station is built next year. Other user increases were - Ely 2million users, up 4.7%; 4.5million users at Stansted Airport, up 22 %; Waterbeach had 381,000 users, up10.6%. The station at Newmarket was

called a lost opportunity with just 290,000 users. However, Matthew Hancock, the MP for Newmarket, is on the case! Priorities under review are improved facilities, direct connections to London, half-hourly services to Cambridge and better bus connections to the town and racecourse. Lucy Frazer, our local MP, attended a Commons debate on the Cambridgeshire and wider regions as the bid for the East Anglia Rail Franchise closed at the end of December. She stressed the importance of securing upgrades to the existing rail infrastructure. She also raised the need for the Ely North Junction upgrade to go ahead as soon as possible as well as doubling the track between Ely and Soham. She pointed out that Cambridge is unique in that it is a net contributor to the Treasury and we need to be able to continue delivering economic jobs, growth and investment and we, therefore, need improvements to our rail services from whoever secures the franchise - improved efficiency, reliability and necessary upgrades. Cambs C.C. and ECDC are working with National Rail to take the Soham station project a step forward using the 'GRIP 3' process - developing detailed plans and looking at levels of investment needed. Concerns have been raised by Milton councillors about the level of parking spaces to be provided at the new Cambridge North station. 3,000 journeys are estimated to take place from the station each day. Fresh plans are now being looked at - the 450 space car park could be moved so that, if required in the future, it could be turned into a multi-storey. Completion December 2016 or May 2017? Stansted Airport station is to have a direct bus service to central London operated by ComfortDelGro and terminating at King's Cross. There are also to be new additional weekend services from Cambridge rail station to Stansted.
