

### RE:NEW Church Family

### BE VIGI-LENT...

Lessons I have learned through Lent this year transcend the observance of a 40 day fast. I spent Ash Wednesday in Manchester city centre on an 'Urban Retreat' - taking time to be still and attentive in the extreme busyness. Stopping; not just to look, but to notice; asking, "Where is God?" and experiencing Him and others in a deeper way. During this exercise I realised how much I have adapted to rural Cambridgeshire, as I struggled to be attentive and find peace amidst the constant noise of buses, trams, people rushing from A to B and the almost constant sound of sirens.

As hard as it was to retreat in this environment, I did indeed see God.

For me, this is what Lent has been about - Taking time out to look for God; hence, vigilent! I noticed God in the creativity and beauty of an outstanding female guitarist & vocalist, talented enough to be signed to a label and touring the world - busking in Piccadilly Gardens with only a dozen people taking the time to watch and listen.

I felt genuine compassion for the homeless men and women, and those who appeared to be in pain. I felt confusion and frustration at the vast numbers of people out 'together' but not engaging with one another. Friends, family members, couples, gazing at small screens rather than at the faces of those they were with; present, but not fully present.

I smiled at the joy, grace and kindness of people giving 'free hugs' and white roses to passers-by.

Much of the beauty I noticed and the experiences I had that day were momentary, there one moment and gone the next. I was challenged to be attentive and make every moment count, to recognise opportunities to experience God in the beauty of my surroundings and the people I share them with.

I hope to continue to be vigi-lent, beyond Lent. I want to go beyond the surface, beyond the book cover, beyond first impressions, beyond my current experience of something or someone - to see situations and people as God sees them, indeed to see God in them. Will you join me?

May you see God today.

### Parish Notes

Our new District Councillor who was elected last month, Alan Sharp, came to introduce himself at our March meeting. He reported that the District Council have frozen their budget for 2016/17 so their part of council tax will remain the same.

Our County Councillor Mathew Shuter was also at the meeting. Following on from a resident request for an improvement to the bus stop on the A1303 Cambridge route, he reported that he had spoken with the Highways Officer. It was accepted that it would not be possible to put a bus shelter here due to the location of the farmer's gate but the Highways Officer will liaise with the farmer about putting an area of hard standing down on one side which would be an improvement on the current situation. It is unlikely that any improvement to footpaths by the A1303 bus stops will happen though as this would be too costly. There had been some damage to one of the speed humps in Bell Road which had been reported and the County Council have said this will be repaired within the next few days.

We have been unsuccessful in our bid for County Council Highways funding for lay-bys to be put in at the 'triangle' area. We will now have to consider if we want to proceed with this project at our own cost and this will be discussed at our next meeting. County Councillor Shuter submitted an application for funding to reduce the speed limit through Six Mile Bottom, part of which comes under the parish of Bottisham. This bid was also unsuccessful and he is talking to local residents to try and see if he can raise the funds locally to get this work done.

We did report a couple of months ago that Bottisham had applied to become a 'neighbourhood area', which is the first stage of developing a neighbourhood plan. This has now been approved although we recognise that the next stage of developing a neighbourhood plan is a lengthy process which we will proceed with in the future. The local plan is being revisisted, which forms part of the neighbourhood plan and this is the priority for parish council at the moment.

We are proceeding with plans to purchase land in Lode Road for a new cemetery. We have contracted a professional cemetery consultant who is liaising with the District Council and other agencies for us. We hope to begin a Tier 1 assessment of the land for the Environment Agency this summer which is one of many tests required.

Bottisham Parish Council's new website will be launched soon. Find out details on upcoming events, village announcements as well as walks around Bottisham etc. More information will be available in the next edition of The Cresset.

Just a reminder that residents are welcome to come to our Parish Council meetings, the next one is on April 4th, 7.30pm in the Poppy Room at the Royal British Legion. We also have our Annual Meeting on Thursday May 26th which everyone is welcome to attend and it is a good opportunity to find out what is going on in the village.



### **Shed Security**

Unfortunately thefts from sheds are common. Many people store things such as cycles, motor bikes, golf clubs, DIY power tools, lawn mowers and other garden equipment in their sheds. It is no wonder thieves are targeting them to get access to such valuable items.

The following are some tips to help secure your shed and prevent a thief walking away with your belongings.

Access - How easy is it to access your rear garden? Protect the boundary and access of your garden. A hedge or fencing at a height of 2metres is a good barrier. Fit a strong, lockable high gate to deny easy access to the rear of the property. Thieves dislike gravel as it is noisy to walk on

Do not use barbed or razor wire or other harsh toppings on top of a fence or wall. You could be held legally responsible for any injuries caused.

Location - Locate your garden shed so that you can clearly see the door and window while you are still within your property.

Locks - Use a good quality padlock/hasp or a motice lock on the door. If using a hasp ensure the screws are covered and cannot be easily tampered with. Anti-tamper screws are available or the use of coach bolts a closed shackle padlock is less easy to access and cut with a bolt cropper. If fitting a mortice lock ensure the door panel and frame are strong enough to hold the fixtures.

**Hinges** - Having protected the locking side of the shed door, look at the hinges to make sure they are not easily removed. Again, use anti-tamper screws.

**Doors** - Make sure the door panels are strong enough preventing them being easily kicked in or forced using bodily pressure.

Windows - Deter window shopping by obscuring the view inside the shed, use netting or even a black bin bag on the interior. Fitting Perspex or laminated glass will offer good protection.

**Lighting** - Illuminate the shed with PIR lighting, thieves dislike being seen, the light will be a good deterrent.

Alarms - If you have a house alarm, consider extending the coverage to your shed. Stand alone shed alarms are available or a contact alarm that fits to the door. Alarms are available from East Cambs Crime Reduction Officer. Sue Loaker at a cost of £8:50 Tel: 101

Valuables - Use a ground or wall anchor to secure cycles, lawn mowers and other valuable items. Visibly and permanently mark your property, this helps to identify the property as being yours and makes it less desirable for a thief.

### Bottisham & District Gardening Club

Daniel Lee gave the February talk on A Plantsman's Adventure in South America: a study of the diverse flora of Peru. Following a holiday in Peru in February of last year, Daniel was so taken with the people and the area around the Amazon that he followed it up, with the benefit of a personal guide, on a second more detailed visit in August. This is a very warm and humid area providing ideal conditions for many beautiful tropical rainforest plants. He trekked through the river banks of the Amazon, climbed the Andes Mountains with barren scrub on one side and, having coped with altitude sickness to reach the crest of the mountains, found a completely different lush rainforest on the other side. It was a very different climate and habitat to the one we're used to here.

Have you heard of Companion Planting, which is simply growing plants together for their mutual benefit? Many plants influence others within their vicinity and one of the best is the marigold, especially French or African marigolds. The flowers encourage hover flies which eat predators, the roots give off secretions which help prevent invasive weeds such as bindweed and thistles, and they also encourage strong growth. If you grow tomatoes outdoors, put a row of marigolds next to them for greenfly. If your tomatoes are in the greenhouse, put the marigolds in the growbags with them to prevent whitefly.

Another well-known companion is lavender planted under roses, which helps prevent both blackspot and greenfly. Interplanting with some allium, with its strong onion smell, also helps. Foxgloves are another good companion plant; they look good, encourage bees, and stimulate growth in surrounding plants.

Carrots grown on their own suffer from the carrot fly, which homes in on the smell of the carrots so disguise the smell with onions or herbs which mask the smell - leeks or onions do best, but rosemary or sage also work well.

If you have a weedy patch which you would like to cultivate, try planting potatoes for a season. The foliage shades the ground underneath making it difficult for the weeds to survive and 'earthing up' turns the soil over and weeds can be winkled out easily.

Some plants don't make good companions. Top of the list is fennel, nice foliage but it has a bad effect on the plants growing nearby. Dandelions should be eliminated for the gas they emit, and buttercups are greedy feeders and take the goodness from the soil.

### Jolley Old World

### A National Anthem for England!

Having attended a number of events, sporting in particular, I have always been slightly embarrassed by the fervour that spectators from other nations put in to the singing of their representative anthems. For example the 'home nations' and the Welsh with 'Hen Wlad Fy Nhadau' - "Old Land of My Fathers"; the Scots with 'Flower of Scotland'; and the Irish with 'Amhrán na bhFiann' - "A Soldiers' Song". The passion and emotion that is exerted in the singing of these anthems is nothing short of astounding verging on possibly intimidating. I honestly cannot say that I notice the same fervency and 'hunger' when English sides sing the National Anthem - it seems too well-mannered and gentlemanly for such sporting contests. This is not to say that I am against the National Anthem, after all I am a committed Monarchist, and the Anthem truly has its place at all state occasions and at diplomatic functions. But the English do need to find something that can inspire a zealous patriotism.

The British National Anthem, as we refer to it today, dates back to the eighteenth century. 'God Save The King', was a patriotic song first publicly performed in London in 1745. The words and tune are attributed to the 18th century composer Thomas Augustine Arne, but may even date back to the seventeenth century. The practice and custom of greeting monarchs with the song as he or she entered a public place was thus established and became known as The National Anthem. The words we use today are still those sung in 1745, but substituting 'Queen' for 'King' where appropriate

Well, that aside, the debate is now on I understand to find a suitable song or piece of music that can be played or sung at events where England is represented as a distinct nation. So what's on offer and let's have a look at some of the contenders?

"Land of Hope and Glory" is a British patriotic song, with music by Sir Edward Elgar and lyrics by A. C. Benson, written in 1902. In 2006 a survey conducted by the BBC suggested that 55% of the English public would rather have "Land of Hope and Glory" sung at sporting events in which England competes as a separate nation than "God Save the Queen". The music to which the words of the refrain, "Land of Hope and Glory, are set is the "trio" theme from Edward Elgar's Pomp and Circumstance March No. 1. The words were fitted to the melody on the suggestion of King Edward VII who told Elgar he thought the melody would make a great song. In fact, only the first of the seven stanzas of the Ode's final section was re-used, as the first four lines of the second stanza. It's this stanza which is the part popularly sung today at the 'Last Night of the Proms.'

Land of Hope and Glory, Mother of the Free,

How shall we extol thee, who are born of thee?

Wider still and wider shall thy bounds be set; God, who made thee mighty, make thee mightier yet,

God, who made thee mighty, make thee mightier yet.

"I Vow to Thee my Country" is also a British patriotic song, created in 1921, when a poem by Sir Cecil Spring Rice was set to music by Gustav Holst. The poem described how a Christian owes his loyalties to both his homeland and the heavenly kingdom. The first verse, and the rarely sung second verse, refer to the United Kingdom, and particularly to the sacrifice of those who died during the First World War. The last verse, starting "And there's another country", is a reference to God's kingdom. Gustav Holst adapted the music from a section of 'Jupiter' from his suite 'The Planets' to create a setting for the poem.

I vow to thee, my country, all earthly things above,

Entire and whole and perfect, the service of my love;

The love that asks no question, the love that stands the test,

That lays upon the altar the dearest and the best;

The love that never falters, the love that pays the price,

The love that makes undaunted the final sacrifice.

Now unlike the two contenders above "Nimrod" is a delightful haunting melody that builds to a

glorious crescendo. Also composed by Sir Edward Elgar; Elgar described how on the evening of 21 October 1898, after a tiring day's teaching, he sat down at the piano. A melody he played caught the attention of his wife, and he began to improvise variations on it in styles which reflected the character of some of his friends. These improvisations, expanded and orchestrated, became the 'Enigma Variations' of which Nimrod is one variation. As it's such an emotional melody the Nimrod tune has had different lyrics added over time ranging from sacred to secular. There is a version titled 'We will stand together' and the words shown below are those sung in the final climax of the piece. And now to "Jerusalem" a seemingly firm favourite. As we are approaching the 100th anniversary of the death of Sir Charles Hubert Parry what could be more fitting a tribute to a great English choral composer! While there is no official national anthem of England, 'Jerusalem' is considered to fill such a role and moves are afoot for England to have this as its own anthem. Words by the poet William Blake, set to music by Parry, are frequently sung as an office or recessional hymn in English cathedrals, churches and chapels on St George's Day. In January 2015, Member of Parliament Toby Perkins introduced the 'English National Anthem Bill' to the House of Commons which was later adopted by the house. The bill will be debated in a second reading on 11th March 2016. So, by the time you read this article we may know how the debate went. Personally I feel the words to the second verse are probably the most appropriate:

Bring me my bow of burning gold!

Bring me my arrows of desire!

Bring me my spear! O clouds, unfold!

Bring me my chariot of fire!

I will not cease from mental fight,

Nor shall my sword sleep in my hand.

Till we have built Jerusalem

In England's green and pleasant land.

And finally for a more secular choice "There'll Always Be an England" has a strong following. An English patriotic song, written and distributed in 1940, was highly popular throughout World War II. It was composed and written by Ross Parker. The words were written by Hughie Charles, and the most popular version was sung by Vera Lynn.

Red, white and blue; what does it mean to you?

Surely you're proud, shout it aloud,

"Britons, awake!"

The empire too, we can depend on you.

Freedom remains. These are the chains

Nothing can break.

There'll always be an England,

And England shall be free

If England means as much to you

As England means to me.

So what would your choice be? Me! I'd go for "I Vow to Thee My Country" by Gustav Holst. May be you'd like to have your say...

"May the sun in its course visit no land more free, more happy, more lovely, than this our own country!" Anon.

### Once again - LOOKING FOR SUPPORT - in the Bottisham area

As I wrote in the Spring of last year, living with physical impairments can be hard, but isn't the end of the world. What you need is the help of a few wonderful people. Writing in the Cresset last year generated some fantastic responses and allowed me to develop a small team, which has worked really well. All team members have been fantastic in supporting me to live my life in the best possible way.

Now a loyal long term (7 years!) member of my team is planning to leave and I need to find a replacement; but how will I do this?

How does one find the right person? Sometimes, I think it is sheer luck, a chance meeting, a friend of a friend, just someone who happens to know..., a positive response to a shop ad, a paper ad? I've certainly many times 'been lucky', some would call it Providence. So, as writing in the Cresset last year really worked, I'm trying this route again.

I have been living with the effects of Multiple Sclerosis and been disabled for more than 15 years. Before that I was working as a health professional in the Health Service. I've always experienced 'my illness' as a double-edged sword. And on the right day and at the right time it can certainly be experienced as a spiritual process and it has led to much creativity. But don't get me wrong, it can also be extremely frustrating, limiting and infuriating.

Going back to finding the right support, it can be really challenging. Times when it seems really hard to find that 'right person', matching availability with need. ### Bottisham WI

Ellee Seymour was our speaker for the February meeting. Her book, "The Shop Girls" is about the history of Heyworth's, a department store in Cambridge. It was originally opened by George Heyworth, who had moved from working in a Lancashire cotton mill to become an assistant at a Luton draper's shop. He came to Cambridge and in 1914 he opened a store in Burleigh Street with a thriving hat department. It later transferred to Sidney Street with his son, Herbert taking over from his father. Ellee's research tells the stories of the lives of four of the shop assistants working there from the late 1940's to the 1960's. It is a true story of hard work, friendship and fashion in an exclusive fashion store. There were many comparisons with the TV series "Mr Selfridge." A few members remembered shopping at the store which closed in 1965 and commented on the more glamorous fashions of the time and the excellent quality of Horrocks's cotton dresses which were sold there.

We plan to have a cake stall on 14th May, at The Triangle along with the Library's book stall and the Gardening Club's plant sale. Items for Ward S at Addenbrookes continue to be made. Our Dart's Team is doing well and has won the first two matches against Milton WI.

### **Public Transport Matters**

We continue to enjoy the slightly smoother ride of the recycled bio-buses but the seats are also rather smoother! Greener, smarter is the claim on the bus exterior but as fellow travellers also report, you do have to hold tight if the bus slows suddenly. Stagecoach did a good job of coping with the blocked A1303 when there was the horrific accident recently. The 11 and 12 were diverted to come down the High St. and I saw a 10 come down the High St., reverse into Beechwood Avenue opposite the new bus shelter and check if anyone was waiting. I am not sure how often that happened. I wrote to thank Stagecoach and had an appreciative reply saying they did hope to provide a good standard. The Bikebus Explorer service is to be suspended on March 27th due to lower passenger numbers than expected. It is run by S. Cambs. district council and the initial pilot scheme was extended but it hasn't covered its costs.

Booking offices at Huntingdon, St. Neots and Royston stations are to be closed at offpeak times but there will be new Station Hosts on the concourses, who will be on duty for longer than the booking offices are currently open. The stations will be staffed from the first train in the morning until the last at night - important station facilities such as waiting rooms and toilets can also be open for longer.

City Deal, Cambridge Connect, Smarter Cambridge Transport - all sorts of plans are being discussed to alleviate the problems of congestion in Cambridge. Now again there is talk of tunnels and light railway routes even out to Newmarket via the Marshall village Wing and then the connecting buses. All lines would connect with the central railway station and park and ride sites. Inter-city coaches would deliver passengers to the light rail network at the periphery reducing coach traffic in the inner city and providing passengers

with faster access to the centre or other stops on the network. However, the County Council and the City Deal say that busways cost one fifth of light rail and do not involve digging up the streets to install the rails or overhead power lines.

My e-mail correspondence with National Express since 2013 regarding the lack of information at the bus stops on Newmarket High St. regarding the services (727, 497) that are available from there continues. I have now been promised paper timetables to display in the library and also been given messages to give to Newmarket library, TIC, Premier Travel and the information desk in the Grafton Centre so they can request paper timetables. No timetables received so far but the promise is progress! The tracker service on their website does gives details of all the services and I think the 370 also calls.

North-south Crossrail 2, planned to cut congestion on trains and the tube, has effectively been approved after receiving endorsement from the National Infrastructure Commission. It could cost £32 billion and be completed by 2033 - from Tottenham Hale in the northeast to Wimbledon in the southwest. It could be financed by a levy on new building developments, a 2p levy on business rates and a rise in local bus and train fares. The Queen is delighted that Crossrail 1 will become the Elizabeth Line in 2018. Her 25 years on the throne were marked by the Jubilee Line in 1979.

There are plans for a high-speed rail network across the Pennines halving rail travel time in the north -Leeds to Liverpool in 50 minutes not the present hour and a half. This is part of Mr. Osborne's 'northern powerhouse strategy' - 6 cities to be linked with 140 mph trains.

Did you see the Flying Scotsman as it passed nearby? There are other great British steam train rides – the Kent and East Sussex Railway, Ffestiniog and Welsh Highland Railways, Vale of Rheidol Railway, Ceredigion, West Somerset Railway, the Jacobite West Coast Railways, Scotland and the Romney, Hythe and Dymchurch Railway.

Planning a holiday? Forget the tiring airports and take one of the many ferry crossings from the British Isles, recently featured in a National Ferry Fortnight. Visit discoverferries.com - the one-stop shop for up-to-date news about travelling by ferry - you could save 20% when you book your ferry crossing. 
