Bottisham WI

A busy May meeting held at Queens Court with a most interesting speaker, Ruth Pym. She has been involved for several years in the Charity Fine Cell Work which trains men and a few women in prison to do high quality paid needlework in the long hours spent alone in their cells. This fosters confidence, hope and self discipline and the aim is to enable them to acquire new skills, to earn and possibly save money and to find the self belief to stop offending. Teams of 6 trained needlewomen go into jails twice a month and run 2 classes of 10 people - mainly long term prisoners and some serving life sentences. They do mainly canvas work and embroidery and choose their own designs from well known designers and choose their own colour schemes. They also sometimes do commission work for the National Trust. Completed items are sold (including on line) and the money provides materials for further work. The majority of the prisoners have mental health problems and whilst they initially sign up to earn some money they benefit by connecting with others in a calm pleasant atmosphere, learn new skills and how to react with and help others and are mindful of the present moment - you definitely need to concentrate when you are counting stitches. No scissors are allowed nail clippers are used for cutting threads! Several completed items were on show, stitching was excellent (front and back) and very colourful. Mrs Pym was a good speaker with a calm reassuring manner using her own teaching skills to good effect and making a difference as a volunteer.

Funds have been helped recently with a soup and pudding lunch at the Royal British Legion and the cake stall on the Triangle in May which sold out quickly and raised £105. Arrangements were made for the trips to Newmarket Stud and our summer outing to Sandringham in August.

Some members attended the AGM of the County Organisation at Comberton and enjoyed an entertaining and uplifting talk by the Reverend Richard Coles. He spoke about being part of the 1980's pop group the Communards, to being ordained as a Church of England priest and having his own parish as well as appearing regularly on BBC television and radio.

We were unfortunate to narrowly miss qualifying for the darts final this year but are continuing to practice on Monday evenings at the Royal British Legion.

Some members attended the group meeting of nearby Institutes, an annual event, and were lucky to hear Eliza McClelland's lively talk on "To Bead or not to Bead". She is an actress, married to an actor and from a family of actors and in her rest periods she taught herself to do patchwork, decorative needlework and beading. She used off-cuts of material discarded by various wardrobe departments for her first project - a magnificent red, gold and pink patchwork bedspread and has been inspired by things around her such as stained glass windows or the Peter Pan Sculpture for other work. A vivacious speaker.

Our next meeting is Tuesday 19th July with Jacqueline Scherer speaking on "Her African Charity" at 7.30pm in the Lecture Room at Bottisham Village College.

Parish Notes

One of our Councillors Ros Hall has tendered her resignation after 5 years service. We would like to thank her for all her hard work over this time particularly with her help with the Environment Committee and Planning. She will be greatly missed but we wish her well. This now leaves a vacancy on the Parish Council. If anyone is interested in becoming more involved in the community they live in, please make contact with either myself or our Chair Christine Bryant - numbers are listed in the Cresset or on the website. This is an exciting and busy time for our village - with new housing developments, plans for a new cemetery and the creation of a neighbourhood plan there is lots going on.

East Cambs District Council is preparing a new Local Plan for the District. As part of this, the Council sought suggested development sites for potential inclusion in the Local Plan. This 'call for sites' has just been published. Suggestions are made by landowners, developers and any other interested parties. Some sites in Bottisham have been suggested and Parish Council will be meeting this month to discuss this in more detail and I will report back on this next month. It is important to note that these sites are only suggested sites and have not been discussed by the District Council or Parish Council in anyway. You will have noticed the building work at the Crystal Structures site is well underway. Once the development is complete, it will be known as Lysander Close in memory of the planes that once flew from the site.

Last month we had our Annual Meeting where residents are welcomed to come and hear what Parish Council have been up to and what its plans for the future are. We also had several speakers including Mr Belzar - Primary School Head, our PCSO and the Chairman of Neighbourhood Watch who were very interesting. It was a shame that not many residents took the opportunity to come. Perhaps residents will be interested to meet our local MP Lucy Frazer who is holding an open surgery at the Royal British Legion on Wednesday 3rd August between 6-8pm. If you have any issues you would like to discuss with her please feel free to come along.

Although we are using the same company for grass cutting we have been put with a different branch this year. This has caused some problems, as the workmen are not used to the village. Several areas were missed out last month and overall we were not happy with the cut. Also that blowers were not used after the cut which is what we pay to be done. I met with the manager and gave them a detailed map of the area showing what areas should be cut. They have now re-done the areas that had either been missed or were not up to standard. They also changed the blades on their mowers. The last cut seemed much better, so hopefully the problems have been ironed out but please do let me know if you think an area has been missed. We must also thank Reg Webb who kindly planted the bedding plants opposite the church which look very nice.

With regard to the proposed new cemetery off Lode Road we have now submitted a Tier 1 application to the Environment Agency. This means they can now inform us as to what investigations they wish to have carried out on the site.

The internal auditor has been and audited the Parish Council accounts. If anyone requires a copy then please contact me.

I have been in contact with the County Council asking if they can cut the cow parsley back on the A1303 as the footpath is difficult to negotiate. They have cut the splays at the

Thoughts of a Sports Nut

It's uncanny, in the monthly writing game, how often an interesting story breaks immediately after the latest manuscript is submitted to the editor. In May, it was the postponed last game of the season between Manchester United and Bournemouth, dramatically called off when a 'practice' explosive device was found in the toilets as the stadium was reaching capacity. Credit where it's due: nearly 60,000 people were evacuated from Old Trafford peacefully and efficiently - a valuable exercise in itself, I should think. But the statement issued in the aftermath was, at once, alarming and hilarious!

Alarming because the device had lain undiscovered for five days; alarming also because it begs the question - why in heaven's name does a fake bomb need to look so realistic that it is indistinguishable from the real thing (wouldn't a cardboard box with 'fake bomb' written on it suffice)? And hilarious because the official statement said that it was accidentally left behind after a "training exercise involving explosive search dogs". Sounds like a dangerous (and messy!) business, doesn't it?!

Then in the same month, Manchester United managed to embarrass themselves yet again over the shameful sacking of Louis van Gaal, as they not only allowed the forthcoming appointment of José Mourinho to be leaked to the press before LVG had even been told, but they did the dirty on the Dutchman exactly one hour after winning the FA Cup! 'Man U', once a great club who stood for everything that was decent and sporting in the game, has been here before of course - only two years ago with the departure of David Moyes - so it seems they have either learned nothing from their follies, or simply don't give a stuff about anybody.

Whatever one thinks of his odd personality and somewhat cautious playing style, Van Gaal has enjoyed a quarter of a century of successful management at top club and international level, winning trophies in four different countries, and he might have expected a little more respect from the Old Trafford hierarchy. No need to wonder any more why they're called the Red Devils, eh!

And - as a footnote to this unedifying sideshow - how sad is it to think that, nowadays, finishing in 4th place in the Premier League is more important than winning the FA Cup?!

Back to stadium safety, which has been very much on people's minds recently, with the Hillsborough inquest jury returning a verdict of unlawful killing and (surprisingly?) placing the entire burden of blame for the tragedy on the incompetent and negligent policing. It's a sobering thought that, although this is a decisive moment in the story of the tragedy, there will be no peace for the victims' families for the foreseeable future now that prosecutions will inevitably follow...

With the Bottisham boys away supporting England in the Euros, let us hope that the safety of spectators is of paramount importance to the French authorities, following not only recent terrorist activity, but also in the light of the sickening scenes in Marseilles before and after the match with Russia. England will, of course, have completed the Group Stage of the Championship by the time you read this and, despite a lukewarm series of home friendlies, pre-tournament, our endless optimism affords us hope - even expectation - that we will be returning for the latter stages during July! Naturally, that optimism was tempered somewhat by England gifting Russia a 92nd minute equaliser in their opening game but, as always, we

Put 'Quality of Life' first!

By the time you read this article, that is assuming you read JOW, the country will have decided whether its destiny is safe left in the 'corridors' of the EU or to once again venture out into the big wide world as a fully independent sovereign nation. We all had rationales I'm sure, which determined the way we voted and that is of course what real democracy is all about. Whatever the consensus of the nation let's pray that it will offer the next generation and those that follow the best opportunities to maximise their potential in the world and to be proud of their individualism as virtuous Britons.

Whilst I'm grateful and encouraged by the support occasionally given to JOW I cannot personally condone dogs using the 'Playing Fields' for a number of reasons but none more so than the danger to health contained in even the smallest traces of excrement. As has been mentioned in JOW previously, the playing fields at the eastern end of the College site have been used conscientiously by the people of this village over many decades and I for one would encourage the village to safeguard this historical privilege by continuing to act responsibly.

Now, how many of you I wonder have noticed the following headlines in the local press recently! "Rapid growth needed to keep City in global race". "Build 1000 extra homes a year". We need to build affordable homes". "Disaster if housing forces businesses out of city". "Backlash over City Deal plan". There are so called 'property experts' urging evermore 'housing expansion' in the city and its environs and demanding that developers be 'let off the leash', even suggesting that new build sites equating to the size of Ely are needed if the Cambridge area is to ensure continued expansion and economic growth. And then we also hear of purported 'transport experts' putting forward the 'City Deal' proposals to 'reduce' traffic congestion - congestion most likely self-inflicted by years of mediocre local government that seemingly can't think beyond its immediate term of tenure.

What is missing to my mind in both cases is the infrequently referred to aspiration known as 'quality of life' which, in my opinion, far outweighs this constant scream to build, build, build - with the latest 'solution' to the congestion problems, shaped by Cambridge's ever 'profit hungry' developers, to close roads, remove trees, add more cycle ways, move bus stops and to charge local firms for employee parking. Small businesses in particular single out the romance with cycle lanes as impairing traffic flow in and around the city and that collectively these measures have done nothing other than to jeopardise the ability of small businesses to survive and to make the problems of people getting from here to there far more acute. Aren't these new ideas then yet more examples of self-inflicted mayhem? Cambridge has decisively carved out its global niche and thus cemented its place in the world with its expertise in the fields of education, research, medicine and high tech. Dare I therefore suggest that Cambridge does not need growth or expansion in order to retain its internationally celebrated status.

And staying on the topic of development; East Cambs DC is now working on a new Local Plan for the District to 2030, and has recently called for sites to be put forward as possible locations for development. Details of the sites are in the public domain and if you

are interested can be found on the East Cambs DC website. Unsurprisingly there are new speculative suggestions for development in Bottisham mostly coming from Cambridge Colleges and from the farming community. But whether these proposals get adopted or not is now with the District Council. If the rules are applied fairly, and in accordance with the set criteria, Bottisham should not be as badly affected as some villages in the district.

Talking recently to one of the planning officers they hinted that one of their frustrations was the ongoing objection to housing development in rural villages and in some places the hostility toward the reclassification of Green Belt. I suggested that the resistance from residents within established communities is because current planning policy is seemingly allowing the rural character of their villages to be systematically destroyed. Probably the majority of people living in such villages moved there to be part of a rural setting rather than be assimilated into a small 'dormitory' town with inadequate infrastructure and unsustainable new development. Unfortunately for villages such as Bottisham, within the proximity of Cambridge and close to major road networks, this is a real danger and planners wonder why there is opposition. I don't believe anyone is suggesting new housing of the right mix is not required but if there is such a high demand and a proven need to build so many new houses then why not think 'smarter' and look to build new towns rather than wreck quintessentially rural agricultural communities.

If what is proposed for Cambridge ever takes hold the city and it surrounds will suffer decades of cranes littering the skyline, construction traffic noise and pollution and yes even more traffic congestion chaos. You only have to look at the developments at Cambridge Station, Madingley Road and Huntingdon Road to get a foretaste of what could be in store. Surely, anybody who suggests that new housing developments will see people forgo their cars in favour of their bikes is, quite frankly, living on planet 'daffy'. Is it reasonable therefore to conclude that the Cambridge area is being deliberately engineered to become the stage for egocentric corporations and a speculative investment playground for the super-rich where the 'Quality of Life' of the indigenous population and its surrounding villages doesn't mean a jot...

- ...that a car service exists for elderly patients and the chronically sick who have no other means of transport to get them to and from the surgery for their appointment? This service has been in existence for many years and is run by volunteers from the community. It covers the villages in the surgery's catchment area. If you think you may be eligible for this service and have a genuine need for help to get to the surgery, please speak with a receptionist when you book your appointment or mention it to your doctor who will be able to advise you.
- Why self-care is good for patients: Our local NHS is already overdrawn by several million pounds so all we can do in the way of self care for minor health matters will save resources for care for major health issues. More cost effective use of stretched NHS resources allows money to be spent where it is most needed and to improve health outcomes. Increased personal responsibility for healthcare helps improve people's health and wellbeing and to better manage long term conditions if they develop. This will help to ensure the future of the NHS.
- Despite initial self-treatment, there are still 57 million GP consultations a year for minor ailments at a total cost to the NHS of £2 billion. Research shows that people often abandon self care earlier than they need to, typically seeking the advice of a doctor within a period of 4-7 days. The main reasons for this are:
 - •Lack of confidence in understanding the normal progress of symptoms (e.g. a cold can last up to 14 days)
 - •The perceived severity and duration of symptoms
 - •Reassurance that nothing more serious is wrong
 - •A prescription to 'cure' the illness, even though the same medicine may be available over-the-counter




