APRIL SHOWERS... OR SHOULD THAT BE "WHAT A SHOWER!"



While I write, the B***** debate is still raging and no doubt it will still be going when you read this. So I shall not add to its machinations!

No, my 'thing' this month, apart from the weather, of which more later, is 'signage pollution'. Those signs we see and say" why on earth has that been put there like that?"

They fall into 3 categories for me. Pointless, Duplication and Size.

Pointless. eg. 'NEW ROAD LAYOUT AHEAD'.

If it is new to you, you didn't see what was there before, so are none the wiser! If it is not new to you, it is because you have already seen it, so it is not new! – Pointless sign pollution Duplication.

It used to be that a small village announced its existence by a modest often rustic sign beside the road but quite clear enough to read. Now those village signs seem to come at least in twos on both sides of the road 10ft. up atop twin steel poles. We drive on the left, so why have it on the right anyway.

Incidentally the worst examples of this phenomenon can be seen on roads on Skye, where a village can be 5 houses, but will have four, ten foot naming signs in Gaelic AND again in English 100yds apart. Demarking the start and finish of their parish!

Size. The best local example of oversized signage is on the A1303 at the Missing Sock. Announcing its position as 'Dunsley Corner' (never heard that one before!) it signs the road back to Quy and the cut off to Six Mile Bottom. There are smaller signs on the M11!

Ironically some small signs also seem pointless. Those signs imploring you to listen to some local radio frequency for the latest road report for the area. Blink and you will miss it. That report is just as likely to be about the accident caused by a driver braking hard to read the small print on some pointless sign!

The real reason for this burgeoning waste is I believe a simple one of jobs worth. Council managers responsible for roads have a budget and staff to manage signs. Every year their budget is reviewed and based on previous years. Well they do not want less staff and funding than last year so they make sure they spend every penny of their budget and when all the signs that we really need are done they go round inventing new ones on which to spend the money.

Better that they paid them on the number of unnecessary signs they removed (Because they never do, do they? They just rust away)

What is the connection with The Cresset, I hear you say. Well, getting this off my chest was prompted by the Bottisham Medical practice article and the invitation to comment on

Back to reality and gardening put on hold. Well not really because if you have a greenhouse or even a window sill, you will likely be putting in some seed and seeing the early shoots of spring. News from Bottisham Medical Practice Patients' Group

New Signage: The old dental surgery has been leased by the service for deaf children, which has put up their rather large notice on the Practice nameboard at the car park entrance. The surgery would be interested in hearing patients' opinions on this notice.

University Students: The practice is working with Cambridge University in securing the 2019/20 group of undergraduates who will continue their GP training at the Surgery throughout the year. The Reception team will let patients know when we have students present at consultations and there is the option to decline.

Dispensary: New staff have now been recruited which should ease the pressure there.

Patients' Groups: The GP contract requires practices to have a Patients' Group, the full title being Patient Participation Group (PPG). Each practice is required to make an annual self-declaration electronically to NHS England confirming that they 'have engaged with their PPG throughout the year and made available such feedback to the practice population', 'including actions and reports including where they have acted on suggestions for improvement'. Care Quality Commission inspectors also expect to see and engage with a PPG in each practice.

Walks for Health: The next walks with our accredited walk leader Steve Gilson start at 11.00am from the surgery car park on 12 and 24 April, 10 and 22 May, 7 and 19 June 2019. Do join Steve for a walk he would be delighted to see you. Walks from Anglesey Abbey continue on Thursdays at 10am from the reception area.

We need canvassers to help compile the Register of Electors for this year. The job involves:

- Delivering Household Enquiry Forms from 25 July through to 9 August 2019
- Visiting properties that have not responded and collecting information about the occupants and their eligibility to vote. (03 October through to the 31 October 2019)

We have vacancies in the Bottisham area to cover 926 properties

The work is part-time and can be done from home.

You should not be politically active to take on any aspect of this work.

You should not be a County/District or Parish Councillor.

You should be:

- Able to deal with members of the public
- Conscientious

Have clear handwriting

- · Able to work to deadlines
- Available to canvass properties during the day, in the evenings and at weekends as required

The fees are based on the two stages of employment and are paid per property within the village/area. Holiday pay and any bonuses earned will be paid at the end of the canvass. Full instructions, details of pay and full training will be given.

Payment for Stage 1 is 20p per property only.

Payment for Stage 2 is 70p per property, however If you bring back a completed form from the property for Stage 2 this will be uplifted to £1.20. There is a one off fee to cover mileage of £50.00 (which will be taxable) or alternatively you can record your mileage and be paid 40p per mile (which is tax free).

You will also need to complete detailed canvas working sheets during stage 2. Closing date for completed applications is Friday 21 June 2019, If you are interested or would like to know more, please contact the Electoral Services Section on 01353 616460/616459.

Parish Notes

The deadline for applications for the parish council elections will be looming by the time of reading (April 3rd). Unfortunately we did not get much of a response from last month's advert. We have 12 vacancies and applications to date fall well short of this. Ultimately this will have an impact on the work that parish councillors can do to support the village with less people to go round, although we will still work towards providing a new cemetery and a pre-school playground. These vacancies can be filled by co-option after the election and I urge anyone that is interested to please get in touch. Your village really does need you!

At our last meeting our District Councillors reported on why East Cambs District Council has voted to withdraw from the Local Plan, which sets out local planning policies and details where new developments will be built.

It has taken almost a year for a Government Inspector to report back on the Local Plan submitted by the District Council. Proposed development sites at Sutton, Soham and various other sites have had their housing allocation significantly increased. In the Plan there was a policy for each village describing the village attributes and characteristics which they wanted to keep. This was deleted by the Inspector even though it was in the previous plan. Open space in other villages was also taken out. Our District Cllr's reported that it was made clear by the Inspector that the District Council had to adopt the plan or not at all. The District Council therefore voted not to adopt the plan.

Under current national policy ECDC will regain their five year land supply in April 2020 when the current 2015 plan becomes 5 years old and the past lack of delivery by developers gets wiped clean. Therefore the development envelope will once again be secure. There are currently approximately 5000 permissions which have not yet been built so from April 2020 these will become part of the land supply. At this time ECDC will go back to using the 2015 local plan. A new local plan will be formulated but with forthcoming elections this will not be looked at for several months. Until then all policies in place will still apply including protection of the greenbelt.

I have had some emails from residents concerned about the amount of dog litter that is being left around the village. This has also been noticed by several parish councillors. I know the majority of dog owners do clear up after their animals, but can I urge everyone to take responsibility for clearing up after their dogs and encouraging others to do the same. We will shortly be installing some anti-dog fouling signs provided by the District Council. This is not a problem that the residents of Bottisham want!

The investigations are now satisfactorily completed on the planned new cemetery land. We are very grateful to the landowners, Anglesey Abbey, and their tenant (Lord Fairhaven) for their support with the project. However, the land is "inalienable" and so cannot be sold to the Parish Council directly, but only by a compulsory purchase order (CPO) exercised by the District Council. While Anglesey Abbey is fully supportive of a CPO, they need to obtain approval from the main National Trust board for this to proceed. We have every

expectation of success, but have to be patient while the matter is progressed through several internal committees. So, while we continue limited monitoring of the water table, there is not much activity on the project at present. However, we are optimistic we will be able to move towards purchase later in the year and will then discuss our detailed plans for the area with the village.

Public Transport Matters

I have over the years mentioned the helpful newsletter that I have received regularly from Simon Norton of Cambs. Campaign for Better Transport. He used to travel all over the country checking out mainly the bus but also train services. It was a shock to read a whole page about Simon in the Cambridge News on the 7th March due to his recent death. He was a mathematician with an IQ of 178 and represented Britain 3 times at the International Mathematical Olympiad for teenage maths enthusiasts achieving the top grade and once 100%. He attended Eton, the University of London and then Cambridge. He contributed to the Atlas of Finite Groups but at the age of 32 he left maths and decided to work on improving Britain's public transport. He died of a heart condition aged 66. I had mentioned earlier that they were changing the Campaign for Better Transport – I presume due to his ill health.

The transport news is mainly about trains at the moment not buses except for the ongoing problem of the muddy patch stop at the A1303/Bottisham High St. junction. This is now to be sorted by Cambs. C.C. Highways Dept.

The Soham station seems now to be a certainty and is forecast to open by Spring 2021. The cost of the single platform station could be announced by network Rail in June 2019 and £20 million has already been promised by the combined authority towards the delivery of the station. Network Rail is starting noise, vibration and light monitoring work on the site soon in order to support the planning application. It will be on the site of the old station which closed in 1965. There will be a footbridge and car parking facilities. Community drop-in events have been held so that people could see the proposals. 500 people attended. A second track and platform could be added in the future. The plans are on a network rail website for 'reconnecting Soham'. The route is to be operated by Greater Anglia and is on the Ipswich to Peterborough line and would call at Bury St. Edmunds and Ely. A direct link-up with Newmarket and Cambridge is missing at the moment. James Palmer lives in Soham and recognises the needs of local people. He has welcomed a scheme to allow eight-car trains to operate on the route between King's Lynn, Ely and Cambridge which is currently limited to four cars, which results in overcrowding.

The Cambridge to Cambourne busway link is still under discussion - both on road and off road options. There could be a park and ride site along the route – Scotland Farm with access off Scotland Road or by the waterworks with access off the Madingley Mulch roundabout. It was first suggested in 2016 and there have been public consultations. The wish is to get people out of their cars. There will be less concrete involved as technology has moved on since the Cambridge busway and there will be less visual impact.

There are also public consultations on the 'varsity line' plan - the new railway line between Oxford and Cambridge. There are plans for a new station near Cambourne or Bassingbourn. South Cambs. councillors are involved in the discussions as they wish the environment to be taken into consideration. Villages like Gransden and Eltisley and the Abbotsley valley need to be protected. There is the question of a Cambridge South Station or use Cambridge North. The County Council are considering it all. Between Bedford and Cambridge a new line needs to

be built and for the western portion of this journey older railway lines will need to be reinstated and upgraded where necessary. There are five route options. People would like it to include St. Neots.

There are due to be new rail timetables this May and it is hoped it won't cause the chaos as last year's did. This includes Greater Anglia. 1,000 new trains will be introduced. The platforms may be too short!

Brussels defended its competition laws recently as it blocked the merger of Siemens and Alstom. Critics of this decision say that it would be a counterbalance to CRRC, a Chinese rail company and accused the 'backward looking technocrats' of jeopardising Europe's prosperity by insisting on a rule book of three decades ago. The HS2 saga continues with a rail expert warning that the costs of it were never properly analysed. The Go Ahead group – Thameslink and Southern – are back on track. It is one of the UK's big five domestic privatised train, bus and coach groups and employs 28,000 people operating GTR – The Thameslink, Southern and Gatwick Express franchise as well as neighbouring Southeastern. It also runs 5.000 buses with a strong presence in London, Oxford and the northeast. Train commuters could face week-long shutdowns as part of a Network Rail plan to speed up repairs. Bus services would run. The Gov't. has earmarked £52 billion for upgrading the railways over the next 5 years underlining the scale of work in the pipeline



Another satisfied, and saved 'customer' - Thank you for continuing to support EAAA.

Dear Editor,

It is five years since the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change stated that global warming was "uneqivocal" and that human-produced greenhouse gases are "extremely likely to have been the dominant cause of the observed warming since the mid-20th century"; an assessment agreed by 97% climate scientists. Do we really still have to rehearse these arguments? Natural variations in global temperatures over historical and geological timescales are well known, and largely understood, by climate scientists. Variations in solar orbit and rotation can be predicted to a large extent; more difficult are the variations in solar activity. However, for the recent past we do have observations for all these so can model the behaviour of global temperatures over the last century with a high degree of confidence. No climate scientist denies the importance of natural variability; it is, of course, included in every climate model. The warming observed since the 1980's cannot be explained by natural variation alone; it can only be explained by including the warming effect expected from the rise in greenhouse gases observed in the atmosphere.

Solar activity may of course decrease in the near future; there may be large volcanic eruptions to provide some cooling thorugh putting dust into the upper atmosphere. But it is surely foolhardy to risk our future on these hopes.







Thoughts of a Sports Nut

Did you notice how many runners there were pounding the streets of Cambridgeshire during January and February? People of all shapes and sizes in all manner of weather-resistant attire... they even outnumbered the cyclists at times! Of course, it was all about the increasingly popular Cambridge Half Marathon on 3rd March. And what a day it was! There was an impressive Bottisham contingent in evidence, among them Steve Leech, Paul Fullwood, Nina and Marcus Hall (apologies if there are others who have eluded my attention) and the remarkable Chris Darling, whose personal best time of 68 mins 54 secs secured him 2nd place overall. That is a mighty impressive performance and they had to go to a different country (well, Wales) to find someone to beat him! But pride of place must go to a newcomer to distance running: Katy Attwood, who not only won a brave battle against cancer to complete this race, but also raised nearly £1,500 for Cancer Research into the bargain. Katy – you are a heroine of this village and we salute you!

Whilst we're on the topic of running, another (slightly more experienced) English woman pulled off an astonishing feat recently by setting a new record in the Montane Spine Race, a non-stop challenge from Edale in Derbyshire to Kirk Yetholm in the Scottish Borders. The course comprises 268 miles of rough terrain that takes in the Peak District, the Yorkshire Dales, the North Pennines, Hadrian's Wall and the Cheviots, and the competitors must carry all their own kit throughout. Jasmine Paris, a 35-year-old mother, completed the race in 83 hours 12 mins 23 secs, finishing almost 10 miles ahead of the runner-up, and enjoying only seven hours of rest over the three-and-a-half-day duration, 'rest' which included breastfeeding her 14-month-old daughter! It never ceases to amaze me what people will do in the interests of a challenge.

The mention of Wales, above, reminded me that the Emiliano Sala saga took a turn for the distasteful at the beginning of March. On the very day the search for pilot was called off, Sala's 'agents' attempted to steal some moral high ground by accusing Cardiff City FC of "abandoning" the player when he needed someone to organise transport (for a journey that was solely the personal choice of the player). It's evident that the agent Mark McKay, through his father Willie, who is not a licensed agent at all, stepped in to arrange the ill-fated flight and now they are getting all slopey-shouldered over their own part in this tragedy. McKay has made it public that he not chasing Nantes for his fee for brokering the transfer deal; then, just when you think he may have an ounce of decency after all, he rounds off his statement by saying that "I wish I had never gone to watch the guy play"! To make matters worse, it now transpires that there is a query over whether the pilot's licence permitted him to carry a fee-paying passenger at all, and so the sad story continues... I wonder if Cardiff City has coughed up any transfer fee money yet!

Another organisation allegedly employing underhand tactics is the International Association of Athletics Federations (IAAF) in pursuing a revision to the rules governing eligibility to compete in female sports. South African athlete Caster Semenya's lawyers are accusing the IAAF of trying to manipulate public opinion against the two-time Olympic

800m champion to cast doubt over her status as a woman. There is no suggestion whatsoever that Semenya has ever done anything wrong or taken any substances to increase her testosterone levels and it seems, to me, reprehensible that they are connecting her with their efforts to discourage the participation of transgender women in female athletics.

On the transgender issue, I heartily applaud Martina Navratilova and Sharron Davies who have popped their heads above the parapet to be (verbally) shot at by the "determined to be offended" brigade. They have both been labelled "transphobic" for daring to suggest that women who were formerly men might have a physical advantage over women born as women and should not be allowed to compete in female sport even though they can artificially reduce their testosterone to an acceptable 'female' level. Navratilova and Davies feel that, as retired athletes, they can speak out where active competitors cannot. Let us hope that common sense prevails, that men who identify as women can find non-regulated outlets for their sporting inclinations, and that poor Caster Semenya can continue her career in peace.

With the Six Nations Championship still approaching its climax at the time of writing, I'll leave my highlights and lowlights until next month and turn my attention to cricket to round off this missive. England's winter tour of the West Indies has certainly been a mixed bag, hasn't it? Despite a resounding victory in the St Lucia Test, catastrophic batting collapses in Barbados and Antigua lends further weight to the view that one day cricket is the nursery for sloppy test match batting. Nobody expected a 2-1 defeat and one wonders if the England players and selectors were a tad complacent in their approach to the series. Did the selectors also misjudge the requirements for an effective bowling attack? Given that all three tests were effectively won by pace bowling, the over-reliance on spin proved costly. The subsequent ODIs and the T20 matches afforded England the opportunity to exert their superiority, though, notwithstanding some explosive hitting from veteran Jamaican Chris Gayle. Convincing series wins in both formats hopefully put the players in a positive frame of mind for this year's home World Cup (starting on 30th May), but spare a thought for the poor old bowlers, eh? Who in their right mind would choose that discipline in the limited overs game? There were over 800 runs scored in a single day in the 4th ODI v. West Indies in St Lucia... absolutely insane!

SO, WHAT'S GOT THE VILLAGE TALKING?

Well firstly, unlike last year, this is NOT an 'April Fool' – you can only get away with that once! So that being made clear it would seem that last month's short JOW pieces on climate change and LGBT celebration have ruffled a few feathers!

Firstly; some of the replies I've seen on climate change have certainly enhanced my 'layman's' knowledge on 'Milankovic cycles' whereas another has suggested that there is 'unequivocal' evidence that human-produced greenhouse gases are "extremely likely to have been the dominant cause of the observed warming since the mid-20th century". Notice the use of the adjective 'likely' which to my enquiring mind suggests there is still a possible element of uncertainty. We all know how fickle 'computer modelling' can be and whilst we have data covering the past 150 years or so this is but a pin prick in time relating to the historical climate of this planet. That's why in my opinion it's so important to make sure we delve into history from time to time where you can readily find journals and such like written by people who lived hundreds of years ago. And in this context may I recommend a book by C. J. Sansom – 'Tombland' - that throughout the novel provides a very descriptive account - gleaned from historical accounts - of the extreme weather conditions affecting East Anglia in the mid-1500s.

The responses also prompted me to investigate a little more fully and in doing so I found an example of research that exposes a totally different conclusion from the argument put forward above. The research was conducted by The National Academy of Sciences (NAS) entitled - Report on Global Climate Change. What the report did not conclude was that global warming was the result of human activity. In fact it concluded, in a passage incidentally that I cannot find quoted anywhere in the press, that "A causal linkage between the build-up of greenhouse gases in the atmosphere and the observed climate changes during the 20th century cannot be unequivocally established." Further opinion on the subject suggests; "The predictions of severe warming are based on developing climatic models that have, so far, been unsuccessful in simulating history accurately. The models also miss the mark trying to accurately simulate the transition into and out of the ice ages for the past few hundred thousand years." By making mention of this alternative research I'm merely pointing out that there are diverse opinions other than the consensus view and that in all things we should ensure we properly inform ourselves rather than each time follow popular hypothesis. May I also add that it is important to such debate that readers take note of what is written rather than what they think is written.

Secondly; in response to the letter concerning my musings on LGBT celebration, may I start by saying that I don't think our views are that far apart. It is right that people should be able to live their lives in a manner they chose (within the law) and thankfully the days of secrecy about relationships are mostly gone. Yes, of course it is proper to be open about

identity and relationships but in a constructive manner and not, may I suggest, in such a way that might be considered as having it continually 'pushed in one's face' by a persistent need by some in the LGBT community to publicly celebrate.

As with all things in life we have to accept that there will be things that we cannot do or achieve and in my opinion this has to apply equally to those men and boys who identify as women. Not to do so is utter selfishness...

And finally remember Gina Miller – the affluent business woman activist who, through the judicial system, challenged the sovereignty of the Brexit result and the government's authority to implement Brexit without approval from Parliament? Had the Supreme Court and its interpretation of EU law not found in her favour then the Government alone, not parliament, would have been able to negotiate and to implement the nation's decision. As it is, and as a result of the ruling, parliament has been able to claw back sovereignty on this issue - which incidentally it surrendered to the electorate by allowing the referendum – that has left the door wide open for individual MPs, the Labour opposition and minority groups to frustrate the Government's negotiating hand in the hope of forcing a No Deal, a General Election or worse still another referendum.
