### **Dear Editor**

During Covid we have turned a 'blind eye' to people walking along the grass margins around these fields near Bottisham college, but as the Spring has progressed, we have also seen increased levels of foot traffic across the rest of the farm as well.

Now that we are seeing an end to various restrictions arising from the Coronavirus pandemic, we wish to highlight that there are no public rights of way on any of the land which lies to the West or North of the College at Northfield farm.

We also wish to highlight that much of the land is entering into a Countryside Stewardship Scheme and many of the grass margins have been established to try and encourage ground nesting birds, as well as mammals etc.

We have tried to be as tactful as possible when explaining these points face-to-face, but the level of foot traffic seems to be only increasing. We do not really want to erect signage around the farm but may unfortunately have to do so if walkers do not stay on the public rights of way moving forward.

Please can we respectfully ask all walkers to be responsible and only walk on public rights of way.



## **Parish Council Notes**

The May Parish Council meeting is always designated as the Annual Meeting. This means that we confirm who will take lead responsibilities within the Council for the next year. I was re-elected as Chair of the Council and Cllr William Clarke was re-elected as Vice Chair. He was also returned to the role of Chair of the Finance Committee.

The Council has a Planning Working Group, which makes recommendations to the Council in relation to planning applications we have been invited to comment on by East Cambridgeshire District Council. We gave grateful thanks to Cllr Hilda Buchanan, who has decided to step back as Chair after over 45 years involvement in planning - although she will still remain a member of the Group. We are grateful that Cllr John Wilson has accepted the Chair in her place, bringing extensive experience of planning from a previous role with another parish council. Cllr John Wilson expressed his appreciation that that he would still be able to draw on the enormous well of experience and local knowledge that Cllr Hilda Buchanan has acquired over the years.


I am also delighted to be able to announce that Nadene Cundell was co-opted onto the Council at the meeting, bringing to the role valuable experience from her professional life, as well as a clear commitment to work for the benefit of our community. This means the Parish Council now has its full complement of 12 members.

At our April meeting we thanked and bade farewell to Cllr Mathew Shuter, who was retiring from his role as County Councillor representing our area. A couple of days following the May meeting, Cllr Alan Sharp was elected to the County Council in his place. He knows Bottisham well, having previously been the District Council member for this Ward. He is now the District Council member for the Woodditton Ward and was elected Chair of East Cambridgeshire at its annual meeting this month – a busy life!

I noted with interest that one of the questions posed on "Look East" to the new Mayor for Cambridge and Peterborough was about litter - something that blights many villages. We employ two young people to pick up litter from the streets in the village. However they

only walk their "patch" once a week, so there is inevitably a build up in between - and of course they cannot visit every corner of the village. So I want to thank a number of you who have recently been volunteering to remove litter from our green spaces. We can only keep the village really tidy with the support of residents and, of course, everyone playing their part in taking care of their own litter in the first place.

Finally, I would like to draw your attention to a new section on the parish website. The single largest portion of the mail we receive from local people concerns faults they have identified in our environment. Frequently they are sent to the Parish Council, because it is not immediately obvious where they need to be directed. For that reason we have set up a new page on the website with links to relevant websites for the most commonly occurring faults. If you know of any others we should add, please let us know! I would encourage residents to make the report themselves, as you will be best acquainted with an issue on your doorstep - and so be able to provide better detail. ## **District Councillors' Report**

At the Annual Council meeting, appointments on committees for the next year were confirmed. Alan Sharp was elected Chair, and Dan Schumann Vice-chair, of Council. Charlotte and John remain on the Finance & Assets committee; Charlotte is a member of the newly formed Audit Committee and the Bus Working Group. John remains on the Planning Committee, and he is a new appointee on the Operational Services committee.

The government is not allowing English Councils to continue remote meetings, so we are returning to face-to-face meetings. Officers are currently looking at how to do this safely and it may be that some meetings are not held at the Council Offices because a larger venue is needed. Virtual meetings have had their challenges, but the great advantage was that many more residents were able to engage with debates than happens with face-to-face. The Government is consulting on allowing remote meetings, if you would like to express your views, the consultation is open until 17th June at - www.gov.uk/government/consultations/local-authority-remote-meetings-call-for-evidence

The Council agreed to lend £390,000 to the East Cambs Community Land Trust (CLT) to allow them to buy and then sell shared ownership housing on the former MOD site at Ely. We were concerned about the terms on which the CLT would be offering these so-called affordable houses, because the houses would be sold at full market value, even though the CLT was buying them at a discount from the East Cambs Trading Company. The only affordable element was that the new owners would only part own the properties, with the CLT owning the rest; there would be rent paid on the non-owned share, as well as possible service charges, so we questioned whether there would be any saving for the

owners after paying the extra charges. We were also concerned about the security of the loan, as with the other lender the total loans would be 114% of the value of the CLT's share of the equity, against which the loans are secured.

East Cambs CLT's only members are the 5 Trustees, 2 of whom are District Councillors, appointed by the District Council. One of these appointments is also Leader of the District Council and sits as an Observer on the Board of the East Cambs Trading Company and she is a member of the Combined Authority. The role of Observer is not limited to observing at the meetings – they speak at the meetings and steer matters, such as how the Business Plan should be presented. So, this Councillor leads the District Council which lent over £1m to the Trading Company to develop the MOD site, is a member of the Combined Authority which lent several million pounds to the Trading Company to develop the MOD site, attends Board meetings of the Trading Company, which sold the houses at a discount to the CLT, is a Trustee of the CLT which is buying the houses at a discount but selling them on at full market value and leads the District Council which is lending the CLT some of the money with which to buy the houses. As your District Councillors, we are deeply concerned about the accountability and transparency of these arrangements.

## News from Tim...a Vinophile

This month I'm going to focus on one of the fastest growing wine categories, rosé.

Rosé wine has transformed itself from a rather sweet sickly confection to become one of the hottest wine types around. Interestingly, celebrities have jumped on the bandwagon including offerings such as the excellent Miraval (Brad Pitt) and the eponymous Kylie (Minogue).

What is rosé and how is it made? Most rosés are made by the processes of skin contact or by saignée (bleeding). There are other production processes including blending red and white wines together although this is somewhat discouraged these days, in fact it is illegal in France except in the Champagne region. They can be made from a wide variety of grapes from all over the globe with as broad a range of sweetness from highly dry Provencal to sweet White Zinfandels. This means there is a huge choice and variety of flavours.

When rosé wine is the primary product from the grapes, it is produced with the skin contact method. Black-skinned grapes are crushed and the skins are allowed to remain in contact with the juice for a short period, typically two to twenty hours. The grape must is then pressed and the skins discarded, rather than left in contact throughout fermentation (as with red wine making). The longer the skins are left in contact with the juice, the more intense the colour of the final wine. The fashion for very pale pinks means that the skin contact time is a key part of the process when it comes to marketing the wine.

When a winemaker wants to impart more tannin and colour to red wine, some of the pink juice from the must can be removed at an early stage in what is known as the saignée (from French bleeding) method. The red wine remaining in the vats is intensified as a result of the bleeding, because the volume of juice in the must is reduced, and the must involved in the maceration becomes more concentrated. The pink juice that is removed can be fermented separately to produce rosé

Recently the trend has been for pale Provencal style rosé wines with plenty of fruit but without the sweetness. The whole world has followed suit and if you want to experiment outside the south of France check out Vondeling (chwinemerchants.co.uk and Cambridge Wine Merchants) from South Africa or even one of the many new English producers such as Gorsley (gorsleyvineyard.co.uk).



## News from Bottisham Medical Practice Patients' Participation Group

**Dispensary**: The prescription delivery service is in operation. If you have opted for delivery, but do go to pick up your medication please advise the staff of this when collecting as it will have been stored in a different place.

Acute Prescriptions: Please wait **3 hours** after a prescription that has been generated via a phone or video consultation before collecting it. This will ensure that the prescription has been received in dispensary and dispensed. If you cannot pick up your medication, please let the GP know so they can put arrangements in place to get your medication to you.

**Repeat Prescriptions**: Please do not to attend the practice until **5 working days** after ordering these. Social distancing is still a challenge in the dispensary and there are fewer staff working in the actual dispensary because of this, which is why they are continuing to work to a five day turnaround time. This also means that if a certain drug has to be ordered it provides time to get drug supplies in. Please do not ring or attend the practice to see if the prescription is ready before the 5 days is up.

**COVID-19 Vaccination programme – update**: Over the last four months we have vaccinated thousands of patients and are so grateful to all our staff and local volunteers whose hard work, support and dedication has enabled us to help deliver the vaccine to our patients who are most at risk of Covid-19.

The vaccine programme is now entering Phase 2 which will focus on cohorts 10 -12 (ages 18-49). Whilst we will continue to provide second doses to our patients who received their first dose through the practice, we have taken the decision to opt out of offering vaccination services for Phase 2 cohorts to enable us to focus on our day-to-day GP services.

Patients in cohorts 10 - 12 (ages 18-49) will be invited for their vaccine via a text or letter from the National Booking Service and will be able to book an appointment online via nhs.uk/covidvaccination or by calling 119 at one of the local Vaccination Centres, which includes the Grafton Centre.

Patients awaiting their second doses are asked not to contact the practice – they will contact you when it is the right time to book your appointment.

Any patient in cohort 1-9 who has not yet received their vaccine can also still book online via nhs.uk/covidvaccination or by calling 119.

Whether you have had the vaccine or not, please continue to follow all the guidance in place to control the virus and save lives. Face, Hands, Space.

### **Public Transport Matters**

Things are gradually returning to whatever the new normal is going to be. Already there are more people using the buses as children return to school and people to work. Next week is the May 17th further reopening of things. I hope to catch a bus for the first time for many months. The new Cambridgeshire Mayor is looking to improve the bus services in the area and to cancel the Metro plan. There will now be much discussion with those who have been involved in all the planning for the Metro system.

I am going to mention the excellent little Citibus that used to run in a circle round Cambridge. I think it was provided by the city council. Stagecoach East is suspending the Milton Park and Ride temporarily due to the limit on the numbers that can use each bus and the need for the buses to be used on other services. This has caused problems for people who use it to get to work. Route 13 and other routes were experiencing capacity problems.

The UK is aiming to reduce its emissions by 78% by 2035. It is China that makes the electrical vehicle bus - 99%. There is now a commitment to build 4,000 British zero emission buses. There is the Zebra scheme with 120 million pounds allocated.

The founders of Stagecoach, Sir Brian Souter and his sister Dame Ann Gloag, have sold nearly 11.6 million of their shares and ownership will be reduced to 5% over the coming decade. They started with just 2 vehicles in Scotland over 30 years ago. Souter's father was a bus driver and he and his sister expanded Stagecoach in the 1980s and 1990s as the British bus sector was deregulated.

Trains have been much in the news as GWR and LNER trains are all having to be inspected for cracks on the lifting points under the carriages. Services into King's Cross and elsewhere have been temporarily suspended. Arguments continue over the route of the proposed new Oxford to Cambridge rail link as it will involve the destruction of some people's homes and also some green areas. We used to live on the Southern route so friends are in touch with their worries and how the problems can be solved. There is also concern about the freight trains increase. It takes lorries off the roads but it might mean noise at night.

The cost of leasing trains has doubled in 5 years due partly to the introduction of new express trains on the East coast and Great Western lines.

A new book, Lines around Newmarket, has just been published. The Cambridge News had a page of photos and an interesting description of the old rail lines and stations.



### Thoughts of a Sports Nut

This month's missive comes with an apology from me to those readers who don't care for football However, my nutty opinion has been sought by at least two readers of my submissions (possibly a majority?!) so here goes...

Anyone who has been living on another planet for the last couple of months may not have heard about the diabolical attempt of 12 football clubs from England, Spain and Italy to form a European Super League. The breathtaking level of greed and hypocrisy of the clubs' owners in hatching this plan to play in a private, closed competition sparked an unprecedented reaction from everybody on the outside of this would-be cartel and, indeed, from some players and managers inside those clubs. In England, in particular, the press and social media were red-hot with warnings from The Premier League, The FA, UEFA, even the Prime Minister, of dire consequences should they proceed with the ESL project. As the clubs quickly 'lost their bottle', despite threats of "binding contracts" from the odious president of Real Madrid, Florentino Pérez, the whole thing collapsed like a house of cards within 48 hours of announcement.

However, we should remember that there are some deep-rooted reasons why this breakaway was conceived in the first place. And they will not go away! The (mainly) foreign owners of the English clubs (Arsenal, Chelsea, Liverpool, Manchester City, Manchester United and Tottenham) are interested primarily in making money by increasing the value of their assets and, ever since the Premier League was formed in 1992, they have sought to maximise the opportunity afforded by worldwide media coverage. The desire for funds is even more pressing for the likes of Real Madrid, Barcelona and Juventus, who are almost bankrupt following years of paying inflated salaries and transfer fees. It's an issue of survival for them and they were dissatisfied with having to share the spoils from the existing Champions League in its new expanded format. So they managed to seduce the other owners with the prospect of billions of Euros of new money, not just from Europe but from rapidly emerging TV markets in America and the Far East.

We should also remember that football embarked upon this dirty road many years ago as TV money began to take a controlling interest in the structure of the game. The 20-club Premier League was, itself, a breakaway business from the Football League and the scraps of 'trickle-down' money for the other 72 league clubs was just enough to persuade them to 'play ball'. Nevertheless, the rich clubs (and players, and agents) continue to get ever richer while those in the lower reaches of the 'football pyramid' are going bust with alarming regularity.

My point is that the greed and hypocrisy is not solely the preserve of the big club owners. For instance, Sky Group was very quick to come out in support of the 'football family' and the pyramid, but they, more than anyone, are responsible for the current inequities in the English game and you can be sure that Murdoch's acolytes would have been even quicker to dip their big, fat noses in the trough of the ESL. Many players (Neville, Carragher, Keane, etc.), now involved in the media, voiced heartfelt opposition and disapproval of the greed at


the heart of the ESL, but are they not members of the generation whose cynical wage demands crippled the ability of smaller clubs to ever again compete with the 'big boys'? And what about the fans who are not only bleating about the attempt to 'steal their working-class game', but also apparently now demanding that owners relinquish their legitimately held businesses? Please! The Premier League's Owners and Directors Test, which purportedly keeps ill-gotten monies out of the game, is a joke! The German 50+1 rule (where it is unlawful for a club to have commercial investors with more than a 49 per cent stake) has a certain appeal, but I have no idea how the legal complexities of compensating current owners could be unraveled, should that idea be implemented. They would be disqualified from participating in their respective domestic leagues or cups and would have to play each other, ad nauseum, in a closed competition with no entry or exit. How long would it be before the entertainment became monotonous – six months, a year? The other question is: what players would want to sacrifice their domestic medals and international careers to perform in such a league? Not many, I would wager. The net result would be a 'competition' full of has-been players at the end of their careers, seeking one last lucrative contract to finance their ridiculous lifestyles... a Veterans' League! Audiences would dwindle, contracts would be broken and the founding clubs would be left high and dry – a pale shadow of great institutions of yesteryear... and it would serve them right!

DIY - we didn't need to go to a health club to run on treadmills that operate on electricity. We drank from a tap or fountain when we were thirsty instead of using a plastic cup or bottle every time we had a drink of water. Sixty or so years ago people took the bus to town and children rode their bikes to school or walked. Unlike today where Mums' use the family's highly polluting 4x4's and SUVs for the 'school-run'. We didn't need a computerised gadget to receive a signal beamed from satellites out in space in order to turn our appliances on or off, or to find the nearest pub. Our methods of communication comprised letters, telegrams, the telephone and face to face contact instead of digital media platforms whose energy-guzzling data centres use more power than the whole of the UK.

While most climate change activists are focused on limiting emissions from the automotive, aviation and energy sectors, it's the communications industry that generates more carbon emissions than all of the aforementioned sectors, and this is set to rise exponentially. In 2016, it was reported that the world's data centres consumed 416.2 terawatt hours, significantly higher than the UK's 300 terawatt hours. At three per cent of the global electricity supply and accounting for about two per cent of total greenhouse gas emissions, data centres alone have the same carbon footprint as the entire aviation industry. And all this just so that hand held devices can be used to broadcast to the entire world where we are, who we are with, what we had for breakfast and what our opinions are. Could this have something to do with the thousands of cases of identity theft, burglaries and fraud I wonder!! Back then we kept our personal information to ourselves and anything that needed to be said was said face to face – no cyber-bullying or anonymous social media vitriol.

Isn't it sad then that some of the current generation lament how wasteful we old folks were back then without stopping to think about their life styles and the direct contribution they are making to global warming? I think this 'holier than thou' attitude is suitably covered by the biblical adage, 'Take the plank out of your own eye before you take the speck out of others'. Twice-weekly rapid testing is a vital tool in identifying cases of Covid-19 that would otherwise be missed. There are several ways you can access rapid testing. You can take a test at one of the rapid testing sites locally. Your employer may be offering testing in the workplace.

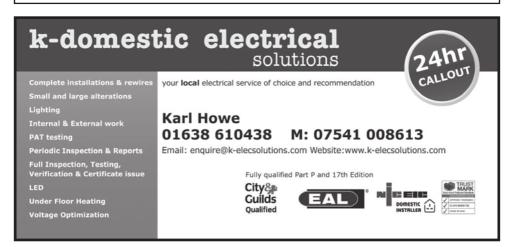
