Parish Council Notes

Alongside the Parish Council's focus on our immediate environment, we also keep an eye on developments in the surrounding area which may impact on the village. You will doubtless be aware of the plan by Anglian Water to relocate the Cambridge Water Treatment Plant from the site in Milton. The outcome of the first stage of consultation is that, despite a number of respondents stating that the plant could be rebuilt on its existing site, the plan is to build a new plant on greenbelt known as Honey Hill. This is located north of High Ditch Road which runs from Newmarket Road to Fen Ditton. The second stage of consultation begins on 22 June, when information packs will be distributed to all households in the surrounding area, including Bottisham.

Cllr John Wilson has attended two meetings on behalf of the Parish Council. He has summarised the key issues that could affect Bottisham as being odour and increased traffic around the Quy roundabout (dependent on the chosen access point). He was assured that the 26 m. high digester towers would (probably) not be visible from Bottisham. We hope that the information packs will give more detail about the plan, so that residents can assess the potential impacts for themselves and make their own responses to the consultation. The Parish Council will continue to assess the impact on the village and respond to consultations

On a more local note, there have been a number of recent incidents of graffiti around the village and in the newly renovated bus shelter. I would ask any residents who spot graffiti to report it to ECDC - the link is on the Parish Council web-site. Any offensive graffiti will then be removed by ECDC. Unfortunately, as the bus shelter is Parish Council owned, the cost of removing the graffiti here fell on the residents of the village. The renovated bus shelter also experienced some vandalism of the roof and guttering. The Council sought the support of the Village College to ensure that the very small number of people responsible for the damage were warned about the consequences of further incidents. The Council values its partnership with the College in caring for the environment we share and is grateful to the staff for working with us to resolve the issue.

My final note is to acknowledge the effect that the unusual summer is having on our environment – long grass! The high rainfall in May meant that contractors were unable to work on some days, while the grass grew much faster than usual. That, coupled with equipment breakdowns, meant that the verges, Cemetery and Churchyard, were left uncut for a much longer period than planned. The areas that the Parish is responsible for have now been cut but, at the time of writing, some paths for which the County is responsible are still showing the effect of the warm wet weather. We hope that normal service will resume from now on.

As I write it appears that "freedom day" may be delayed a few weeks. However, I trust that all residents are still able to enjoy the weeks ahead of (hopefully) warm weather and I wish you all a good break over the summer.



District Councillors' Report

Unfortunately the strategy of ECDC Council that it would hold Zoom meetings as in the previous year, and that the results of any voting on motions or resolutions would advise the Chief Executive was deemed illegal. The Planning Committee met at the Hive, but unfortunately there was no livestreaming. Other Committees are meeting at the Grange, with very restricted access for the public.

Using Zoom, John attended the Better Public Transport - Cambridge Eastern Access Project: to note the recommendation that Phase A on-line improvements to Newmarket Road should be advanced to OBC stage, with a longer term Phase B plan to develop a high quality public transport route connecting Coldhams Lane and a relocated Park and Ride site on Newmarket Road to be developed further if the draft Greater Cambridge Local Plan indicates that the Marshalls site will be allocated for development and land made available; presumption of access via Coldhams Lane rather than the Tins, and potential improvement to the Coldhams Lane roundabout; also potential for reallocation of roadspace on Newmarket Road and Coldhams Lane, and to improve the Cambridge to Newmarket Line in the longer term, with twin-tracking and additional stations—GCP should support EWR Consortium and Network Rail in maximising the potential benefits of this asset.

Regrettably the Administration is not engaging with GCP to any great extent, although almost half the District will be affected by these proposals, even more so when the GCP considers the Northern Access.

I have not lived in Bottisham since 1962 but do get to see The Cresset sometimes and saw where someone was wondering about the old Court House. In the late 1940's there was a Sergeant Brown and a PC. Atkinson living at the back of the Court House and I believe there was also a room for holding a prisoner. I remember my brother had to appear at the Court when he was about 14 as our dog had bitten someone. I think my mother listed him as the owner to probably get a more lenient sentence! I cannot remember what the sentence was! I am not sure how often they held the sessions.

The main person at the Court was a rather formidable lady, I think her name was Miss Francis, and I believe she lived at Fulbourn. Lord Fairhaven was another member of the panel, and also Freddie Fry of Longmeadow.

I am still in touch with Sgt. Brown's daughter Beryl and will ask her if she has any memories of special events at the Court.

News from Tim...a Vinophile

The classic TV comedy sketch about wine buffs will often feature expressions such as "gooseberry", "burnt tarmac", "cat pee" or even "peaches with hints of elderflower". All of these descriptions could be used when discussing one of the most popular and widely drunk wines, sauvignon blanc.

This wine comes in many guises. Are you a lush tropical-fruit fiend or more of a citrus sauvignon swigger? Do you favour a gentle herbaceous hit or the bolder flavours of a barrel-fermented sauvignon? It's worth finding out what you like because not only is sauvignon blanc our most popular white grape by far (selling a third more than pinot grigio), but the spectrum of flavours that it can display is remarkable.

The sauvignon blanc grape originates from the Loire valley and Bordeaux region in the west of France. During the eighteenth century it was paired with cabernet franc to produce what we now recognise as cabernet sauvignon father to some fabulous red wines. It prefers a slower growing time to allow the acidity and sugar levels to balance. The soil can also make a difference. The gravel in the Loire valley soil impart spicy, floral and mineral flavours unlike the fruitier Bordeaux versions.

It may have started in France but the sauvignon blanc is one of the most commonly grown grapes in the world. New Zealand is well known for its combinations of citrus and tropical fruit flavours with an underlying grassiness, the most celebrated being Cloudy Bay from the Marlborough region. The cool maritime climate promotes the slow growth required to give that acid/sugar balance. Chile and South Africa both provide fabulous value for money sauvignon blancs although most countries have now worked out how to make this perennial favourite.

This time of year is a great time to drink sauvignon blanc. Served chilled it can be drunk by itself or with fish, chicken, pasta, cheese (particularly goats cheese) or even sushi. Two of the most popular versions sold in the UK are Oyster Bay and The Ned. Both safe, dependable examples of the genre.

Next time you have a glass, don't just dive in. Swirl the liquid round your glass then breathe in the fumes. Smell those grassy gooseberries and tropical fruits beloved of television sketch writers!

Public Transport Matters - IT DOES!

Wearing masks more people are now prepared to use the local buses but during the day the numbers are still low.

Public transport was a matter raised during the last elections. Buses but now also there is the problem of finding the best routes for the planned East West rail link between Oxford and Cambridge. There is a choice between a northern and a southern route. Both routes are being objected to as they come very near people's homes and will initially be diesel trains. Freight trains are planned to run during the night. It would be good to get lorries and trucks off the busy roads, but people will be affected by the noise.

We lived for 10 years in Little Eversden and I still have friends there and I was shocked to see a picture in the Cambridge News of the proposed high embankment with a train running along it only a short distance from a friend's house. There are campaign groups CBRR CamBedRailRoad and also Cambridge Approaches. The local MP Anthony Browne is involved, and I had positive news when I contacted his office. Lucy Frazer, our local MP has spoken on the radio and has been quoted in the newspaper. She is against the Northern route. I have friends in Dry Drayton who would be affected by that route. It makes it all seem quite personal!

Plans are being proposed for a different route by a local group so hopefully something satisfactory can be decided on. There are also plans to increase rail capacity through Ely EACE. There is a demand for more rail freight between the Port of Felixstowe and the West Midlands.

It would give better connectivity and reliability for passengers.

The metro system is being reconsidered since changes to the people who would have to make the decisions due to the local elections and the new Mayors

National Express has been badly affected by the fall in numbers during the last year,

carrying just 8 pc of its usual numbers but it managed the situation by running just 13 pc of its normal coach timetable. P and O ferries is also fighting for survival due to the lockdown but also the post-Brexit problems causing reduced trade across the Channel. Taxpayers could have been footing the bill for Eurostar but shareholders have now agreed a Eurostar bailout. The cost of maritime shipping containers has continued to rise and the import of large goods from China is being transferred to trains.

Trainline ticketing system may open on the continent due to its problems since Grant Shapps in the government decided to set up a rival service. The stock lost 500 million pounds in value. It has usually sold 70% of the digital train fares.

The government is planning changes to the system running the railways. It will do away with the old franchising system. It will mimic the efficient concession system employed on the London Overground and the capital's buses. It will be named Great British Railways says the Department for Transport. They also say that they want train seats to be comfier.

The InterCity 125 service has ceased. The arguments about HS2 continue. Grant Shapps says it will go to Leeds.

Macron is restarting sleeper trains. There used to be 15. This one will be Paris to Nice at 29 euros or 19 euros in a shared compartment. There will be no dining car.

The Mid Norfolk railway was planning to open in June.





Thoughts of a Sports Nut

So, the six Premier League clubs who proposed to join the ill-fated European Super League are to be fined a total of £20m by the Premier League. One would hope that this money could be cascaded straight down to less wealthy clubs in the English pyramid, which would be a small mercy, but – make no mistake – it's only a small slap on the wrist! Each club, on average, will pay the equivalent of less than six months' wages of a top player for attempting to wreck Football as we know it.

It would be nice to be talking about the actual football for a change, wouldn't it, especially with the 2020 Euros finally under way. But, as a regular 'live' spectator, I feel compelled to weigh in with an opinion on the oh-so-boring 'taking the knee' controversy! In the light of what's been said by the England players and manager, I have changed my stance slightly...

How about "Stand Up To Racism" or "England Against Racism", perhaps with a linked arms gesture, or something along these lines? Anyone who objected to that would be displaying their racist nature for the world to see and the decency of the majority would undoubtedly prevail. If we don't change the approach, this Punch & Judy show ("If you take the knee I'll boo you." "If you boo you're a racist.") will continue ad nauseum. Even John Barnes said that the knee is now an empty gesture and he wouldn't do it if he were playing now! Personally, I'm already sick of it all, aren't you? One thing I do know, though... it is idiotic to think that booing one's team would inspire them to play better and improve their chances of winning!

It has been sad to see the media playing a major role in controversies in other sports, too. At the end of May, Naomi Osaka, the young Japanese tennis champion declined a post-match press conference during the French Open, citing anxiety and depression. This was met with

threats of fines and suspensions from the unsympathetic tournament organisers for breaking her contract with them. The story dominated the media for several days until Osaka voluntarily withdrew from the championship in order to remove the distraction for her fellow professionals! So where should our sympathies lay? Obviously, on a human level, there is no question that the heavy-handedness of the French has escalated a mental problem for the sensitive youngster. Shame on them for that. However, Osaka makes a highly desirable living from travelling the world, playing the game she loves, and how does she think the \$34m she earned last year is generated, if not by virtue of media contracts? A personal counsellor wouldn't make too big a dent in that grotesque sum, would it?

And now, at the time of writing, we have the cricket furore! Some low-life (presumably an 'investigative reporter') decided to ruin Ollie Robinson's England debut – and possibly his entire career – by revealing some embarrassing social media posts he wrote as a teenager. He immediately admitted his misdemeanour and issued a groveling apology. TALKING POINTS!

Rod Liddle in the Times suggests that the public's ignorance of a few 'buzz phrases' shouldn't be mistaken for indifference. Liddle comments that "British identity is very important: the main reason for the Brexit vote and the Tory majority is a deep belief in the nation state, freedom of speech and the UK's history and traditions". There must be some rationale in this reflection as it seems dissent has been sufficient amongst National Trust members to have the NT chairman resign. The feeling is that the Trust had become too 'woke' in readily adopting fashionable left wing social, environmental and political causes, in particular the choice to publish a register of its properties with links to empire, colonialism and servitude. Add to these other fashionable left wing buzz phrases such as 'transgender' bathrooms, 'taking the knee' or the 'fate of statues' and you begin to recognise a 'lunacy' sweeping through our institutions where maths is racist and where physics must be decolonised.

But this lunacy is not recognised by a minority of graduate students at an Oxford College. They are so offended by a picture of the Queen that it has been removed from their common room on the grounds that Her Majesty symbolises the representation of colonial rule. Interestingly the campaign to have the picture removed was orchestrated by a visiting 'American' post graduate who perhaps has his own anti-colonial agenda! However, the majority of members of the Middle Common Room (MCR) have reacted with fury, saying they were angry that they had all been portrayed in a negative light by the decision. Of the 250 post graduate students at the college only 17 people attended of whom 10 voted to have the picture removed.

What is more there is now a war within Oxford University itself between Colleges over the statue of Cecil Rhodes. The provost at Worcester College has instigated a university-wide protest against Oriel College for refusing to take down a Rhodes' statue. A group of academics led by the provost at Worcester College (known cynically as the "People's Republic of Worcester") have signed a letter saying that they will boycott Oriel students. For the record Rhodes made endowments to Oxford University to help set up the Rhodes' scholarship fund that enables students from once colonial countries to study at Oxford. Unfortunately these examples of 'wokeism' are thought to be common place in many academic foundations where a minority influence can demand and succeed in attaining unrepresentative change.

But before censuring colonial history outright perhaps holders of such anti-colonial views should consult with the countries that make up the British Commonwealth. The British Commonwealth or Commonwealth of Nations is essentially a group of 54 countries formed from the old British Empire who, despite their independence, wish to remain united in language and in a set of shared values involving democracy, human rights, education and most importantly the rule of law. None of these countries has been obliged to be part of the

Commonwealth — it's of their own choosing. And nobody has contributed more to the successful transition from the British Empire to the Commonwealth than the Queen herself. The resolve of the former colonies to enlarge the membership is clear recognition of the positive characteristics of empire. Of course the most recognised qualities of the Commonwealth are the Commonwealth Games and the Commonwealth Heads of Government legislature that deliver a steadying influence through a 'Charter' which brings together the values and aspirations of democracy, human rights and the rule of law. There is also the Commonwealth Scholarships scheme aimed at students from across the Commonwealth who would not otherwise be able to afford to study in the UK. By funding postgraduate studies in a range of different study formats, the scheme helps to support future innovators and leaders

It's very unfortunate then that fashionable left wing attitudes in the UK are predominantly advocated by highly educated metropolitans who can see nothing but injustice arising from 'their truth' of the days of empire. 


